We are well into the year and we have held our School of Instruction and I hope all who attended returned home and shared your knowledge with your Posts and Districts. Let's all work hard on membership and VFW programs and make this a banner year for the Department of Indiana and Commander Blake.

Post Commanders, please insure

that Quarterly Audits are conducted by your trustees, and the Trustees Report of Audit is forwarded to Department Headquarters in a timely manner. On these reports we have noticed that some Posts don't have a relief fund or a Dues Reserve Fund. Both of these funds are required by our National By-Laws and Manual of Procedure. Please refer to Section 219 for the Relief Fund and Section 717 for the Dues Reserve Fund.

Did you know that every VFW member can creat their own account to the Online Membership System. Just go to VFW.ORG and click on login and follow the prompts to Create an Account. By creating an account on VFW's national website you will gain access to news releases, program information and other important information available to members of the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Last year we had 40 Post Officers removed as they failed to pay their annual dues prior to the expiration date of their membership. As of October 1,

2016 in the Department of Indiana we have 252 Posts Officers whose membership expires before the end of the administrative year ending on June 30, 2017. Of these 14 expire before December 31st, 130 expire on December 31st, and 108 expire after December 31st. Post Commanders and Quartermasters, please review your rosters and insure these officers renew their dues prior to their membership expiration date.

VFW By-Laws

Sections 220 - Removal of elective officers or committee members. Removal: Elective Officers or Committee members can be removed as prescribed in Section 220.

The Department Commander may, with respect to any Post within the Department, remove any Post Officer who fails to fulfill the duties of his/her office as required by Section 218.

Any elective Post officer removed by the Department Commander, by reason of failure to pay current dues by vote of the Post under the provisions of this section, shall not be eligible to serve in any Post office in the same Administrative year in which the officer is removed.

MENTAL WELLNESS CAMPAIGN

VFW National Commander Brian Duffy and VFW Auxiliary National President Colette Bishop have come together to commission the VFW Mental Wellness Campaign, a new nationwide campaign designed to focus on mental wellness within the military and veterans' communities.

Joined by three high-profile national partners, Give an Hour, One Mind, and PatientslikeMe, the campaign kicked off during a joint press event inside the National Press Club September 13, 2016.

The VFW Mental Wellness Campaign leverages the power, influence and reach of nearly 1.7 million members in more than 6,600 VFW Posts around the world with the nation's leaders in mental health care, research and peer-to-peer support.

The campaign's goal is to raise awareness, foster community engagement, improve research, and provide intervention for veterans, service members, and their loved ones who may be suffering from invisible injuries or emotional stress.

Part of the VFW Mental Wellness Campaign's focus has been working closely with Give an Hour to train VFW-accredited service officers and state leadership to "Know the Five Signs" of emotional suffering as a way to better serve clients coping with invisible injuries, and to help change the narrative on mental health in America through its Change Direction campaign.

In addition to the press event, the VFW and Give an Hour hosted a "Day to Change Direction" on Saturday, Oct. 8. Individual VFW Posts and state departments worked hand-in-hand with Give an Hour's nationwide network of

mental health providers and volunteers, as well as the Department of Veterans Affairs, to help facilitate peer-to-peer discussions on mental wellness, as well as participate in a community action or event designed to empower Americans to "Change Direction" on mental health and well-being.

Over the coming months, the VFW will also work closely with Seattle-based One Mind to encourage VFW members to participate in online communities to better understand and improve their own brain health. They can also volunteer patient and caregiver input to research aimed at developing new evidence-based diagnostic and treatment options.

The inclusion of the peer-to-peer perspective via PatientslikeMe is equally important to the VFW's campaign. The online network helps people living with any one of 2,500 conditions, including post-traumatic stress and traumatic brain injury, to compare treatments, symptoms and experiences; connect with others like them for support; track and learn what impacts their health; and give data for research. The tools and support provided by PatientslikeMe are invaluable to patients, potential patients, and their families.

Though this is a joint campaign commissioned during the one-year leadership terms of Duffy and Bishop, the VFW's goal is to build a sustainable program through which all levels of the organization can remain proactive advocates for those coping with emotional stress, which will build upon the VFW's century-plus legacy of veterans' advocacy, service and assistance to others.
