

GENERAL ORDERS #10

1 April 2022 2021-2022 Series

TO BE READ AT MEETINGS AND POSTED:

1. INSTALLING OFFICERS: Installing officers will see that the provisions of Section 216 of the National Bylaws and the Manual of Procedure are properly conducted and that all officers are members in good standing and qualified to hold office prior to installing Post officers for the current year. Post officer shall not be installed or assume the duties of their office until proof of eligibility has been submitted and carefully reviewed.

Post-Election Reports must be submitted following Post election of officers in April and no later than June 1 to the National Headquarters. It is highly encouraged all Post Quartermasters to use the online Election Report process featured in the Online Membership System (OMS). Post-Election Reports received electronically will be forwarded to the Department Headquarters.

2. VFW National Convention Registration: Attention of Post Commanders is directed to Section 222 of the National Bylaws and the Manual of Procedure, which provides that each Post will pay, in advance, a National Convention registration fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25) which shall entitle the Post to a packet of convention information and materials and one identified registered delegate for the National Convention. Each additional delegate attending the National Convention will pay a ten-dollar (\$10) delegate fee.

Posts are encouraged to register their Post delegate online through the Online Membership System (OMS) or by submitting their National Convention Post and Delegate Registration form that mailed to all Posts as part of the Election Report/Convention Registration mailing that went out in February. Advanced registration for the 123rd National Convention should be mailed with each delegate's name and address to: Convention Registration, 406 W. 34th Street, Kansas City, MO 64111.

- 3. **VFW National Convention Housing:** Indiana has been assigned the Marriott Downtown for the Kansas City, MO Convention. Room reservations/housing forms can be found at www.vfw.org.
- 4. District Convention: Pursuant to Section 403 of the National Bylaws and the Manual of Procedure, each District shall hold an annual District Convention for the purpose of electing District officers, such convention to held not less than ten (10) days nor more than seventy-five (75) days prior to the convening of the Department Convention. District officers shall not assume the duties of their office until the Department Commander is installed. District officers shall not be installed or assume the duties of their office until proof of eligibility has been submitted and carefully reviewed in accordance with Section 416 of the Manual of Procedure.
- 5. State Convention: Will be held at the Marriott East, Indianapolis, IN. The dates are 2 5 June 2022. Please make notes of these dates, making sure all Posts and Districts are up to date on all reports in OMS and monies due, these will be accepted up till Noon on 3 June 2022. See attachment for Room Reservations. District Quartermaster's are required to fax the authorization sheet to the Marriott form is attached.
- 6. State Convention Delegates: State Convention Delegate list is attached. A Post is entitled to 1 delegate for 30 members or fraction thereof. Based on membership numbers as of 1 April 2022. Delegate fee to State is based on the 1 per 30 ratios plus one (1) for the Commander. If your members are 187, that equals 6.24, rounded to 7 plus 1 for the Commander, for a total of 8 delegates. This product times the \$3.00 delegate fee equates to \$24.00 to State. Delegate fees are to be paid on or before 20 May 2022 to the Department Headquarters.
- 7. Admin Fees: Each Post will pay an administrative fee of \$1.00 for every NEW member attained from 1 July 2021 through the date of the Post-Election. Admin fees are to be paid on or before 20 May 2022 to the Department Headquarters.
- 8. All-State: The nomination for All-State Post Commander and Quartermaster is included in these General Orders. The deadline for submission for All-State nominations and related documentation in NOON on April 4, 2022. All material must be in hand at VFW State Headquarters at this time.

- 9. James Butters Award: The James Butters Award in an annual award that goes to a deserving Post Service Officer. The nomination form for this included within these documents. The deadline for submission is April 29, 2022. Submit nominations to the State Adjutant at VFW State Headquarters.
- 10. Loyalty Day and Memorial Day Observance: Section 223 of the National Bylaws and the Manual of Procedure provides that each Post shall make the necessary arrangement for proper observance of Loyalty Day and Memorial Day. Officers should see that suitable grave markers, wreaths and flags of the United States are placed on the graves of deceased veterans.

On-Site/New Registrations

On-site/new registrations will be handled at the convention center in Hall D with registration beginning at 8 a.m. on Saturday, July 16. Remember to download "VFW Events," the VFW's official event app, before you get to Kansas City. It will contain all convention information, including agendas and the shuttle bus schedules. The app can easily be downloaded at the Apple Store and the Google Play Store.

On-site registrants checking in at the convention center will find a streamlined process providing great customer service. Your registration letter will have a barcode on it. Bring that letter with you and our volunteers, armed with Bluetooth scanners, will scan your letter as you arrive and direct you to a kiosk where your registration information will be displayed as you approach. 





1. I received an email/postcard/phone call from a company asking for my personal information and a story about Indiana VFW. Is this a legitimate project?




