

#### TO READ AT MEETINGS AND POSTED

- 1. State Headquarters will be closed Monday, 19 February 2024 to observe President's Day.
- 2. **Commanders** at all levels should begin organizing their 2024 Memorial Day Buddy Poppy Campaign. Every Post is urged to order and distribute VFW Buddy Poppies.
- 3. Attention is directed to Section 213 of the National By-Laws, concerning any Post in arrears for any financial obligations to County Council (if applicable), District, Department and National for fees, dues, poppy money, supply money, failing to have the office of Quartermaster properly bonded in accordance with Section 703, failing to ensure that the Post is properly insured in accordance with Section 709, failing to submit properly completed quarterly Post Trustees Report of Audit, Post-Election Report for the ensuing years, or other obligations, shall be deprived of all representation in County Council, District, Department and National Conventions. Such representation shall be restored promptly upon proper adjustment of such deficiencies.
- 4. **Trustees** shall not be eligible to serve as an elected officer, Adjutant or on a committee whose books, records and accounts are audited by the Trustees. Among the duties of the tree (3) elected Post Trustees, they shall:
  - a. At least monthly, review the Monthly Report of Receipts and Expenditures of the Post Quartermaster.
  - b. Within thirty (30) days from the end of each quarter, properly audit the books and records of the Post Quartermaster, Post Adjutant and any activity, clubroom, Holding company or unit sponsored, conducted, or operated by, for or on behalf of the Post and submit a Post Trustee's Report of Audit to the Department Adjutant for Referral to the Department Inspector.
  - c. The Report shall be in accordance with and upon such form

- as may be prescribed by the Adjutant General. The audit shall be signed by the Post Commander and Trustees, who shall, by their signatures, certify the accuracy of the information contained therein.
- d. Perform such other duties as may be incident to the office or may from time to time be required by the laws and usages of the organization or lawful orders from proper authority.

Thank goodness January is now behind us. I want to thank everyone that made it to the Indiana State House for Legislative Day on Jan 16, 2024. Despite the bitter cold temperatures, we had a good turnout.

The VFW is a member of the "Big 4" Veterans Service Organizations (VSO). The "Big 4" consists of the American Legion, Disabled American Veterans (DAV), National Guard Association of Indiana (NGAI) and the VFW. These 4 organizations represent more than 135,000 Hoosier Veterans. Our organizations gather to discuss issues and determine what "our" priorities will be for the Legislative sessions. We also talk to our legislators about our concerns to improve the quality of life for Veterans in Indiana. This current legislative session has been productive, already we have had a resolution signed to Reduce Veteran Suicide. As individual organizations we also support and testify to assist with getting other organizations priorities passed. A complete list of the "Big 4" priorities are listed in this month's General Orders. Please review the priorities and contact your legislators to help us get these items signed into law.

We have a new Veteran Service Officer (VSO) that will be starting this month. Nathan Mertz is our new VSO for the Fort Wayne area. We are lucky to get Nathan! He has been the Assistant Department Service Officer for the VFW Department of Ohio. Please welcome Nathan to Indiana when you meet him.

February is a great month to call your post members that you have not seen for a while. Make sure they are doing well. Talk to your members about what is going on in the Post. Invite them to come in for a visit. I also would like you to call your former members that have let their memberships lapse. KANSAS CITY, Mo. (Jan. 5, 2024) - The Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) is now accepting submissions for its 2023 National Publications Contest. VFW publications published up to four times annually, or five or more times annually, will be judged in four categories.

The categories are:

#### Department-level publications:

- Newspaper/Newsletter
  - · Defined as being printed on newspaper stock.
- Best Feature Story
  - o All publications judged together in this category and submitted separately. The story must be a published article of at least 300 words. It can be originally written by your newspaper/magazine staff or by a freelance writer, or be reprinted from a newspaper within your state. Feature articles published in online/electronic newsletters, newspapers or magazines also are eligible, but must be printed in color and submitted via USPS, not email.
- Magazine
  - o Defined by physical size and paper stock, or designed for online distribution as a PDF. Online/electronic magazines must be printed in color and submitted via USPS, not email.

#### District/Post-level publications:

Overall Design and Content

Each category will be awarded three places: a grand award (first overall), silver (second overall) and bronze (third overall). Grand prize winners will receive a plaque, and the silver and bronze awards will take the form of a certificate suitable for framing.

The VFW Publication Department's awards system conforms to that of professional societies within the association publishing industry: National Mature Media Awards, Association Trends, Society of National Association Publications, Society of Professional Journalists and Communications Concepts. In other words, the same types of awards for which VFW magazine competes.

All entries submitted must have been published sometime between Jan. 1, 2023, and Dec. 31, 2023.

Examples of eligible subjects for the Best Feature submissions include operations of state VA departments, National Guard/Reserve unit deployments overseas, troop-support activities, Department VFW programs, dedication of state memorials and state or local commemorative events for the 50th anniversary of Vietnam. **Editorials or opinion articles WILL NOT be considered this year**. Articles written by *VFW* magazine staff and reprinted in District, Post or Department publications **will not** be considered. Only one issue per publication will be reviewed by judges. **DO NOT** send multiple editions, as judges will not review all of them.

All entries should be sent directly to the VFW National Headquarters. Similar to last year, the competition will be open to any submission, not just the winning submissions from the Department level. #### What is a "Claim Shark"?

- A Claim Shark is an individual or company that charges hefty fees to "assist" or "consult" veterans with filing their VA benefit claims – this practice is illegal!
- Claim Sharks are not VA accredited, meaning they aren't required to adhere to the
  well-established professional and ethical standards of VA accreditation, so their advice can
  often be misleading or even fraudulent.
- Like a "Loan Shark," once you're in, you can't get out, and may be subject to new and hidden fees whenever you get a new rating, no matter who does the work.

#### Some of their predatory practices are:

- Promising or guaranteeing an increased disability rating or percentage increase.
- Advertising expedited VA claims decisions.
- Requesting login credentials to access a veteran's personal information through secure VA websites like eBenefits or VA.gov.
- Using confusing tactics or ambiguous language to mislead claimants or coerce them into signing a contract.
- Telling veterans to forego VA exams and offering health consultations within their own network of doctors.




