THIS YEAR IS DEDICATED TO MIKE TURNER, OUR DEPARTED BROTHER. MIKE WAS AUXILIARY PRESIDENT OF 1157, PAST DEPARTMENT HISTORIAN, AND WOULD HAVE BEEN 7TH DISTRICT PRESIDENT AND DEPARTMENT LEGISLATIVE CHAIRMAN THIS YEAR.

Item # 1: Past National President Passing: Past National President Rosemary Mazer, who served the Organization as National President has passed away. All Auxiliaries are so ordered by National Headquarters to drape their Charters in memory of Rosemary for 30 days.

Item #2: Election Results: Congratulations to Past District 3 President Gennie Pickens (and current Hospital Chairman) on her recent win by acclamation for Department Guard. We also congratulate Past Department President Sharron Barger on her election as Indiana's National District Council Member Area C!

Item #3: Installation Reports: If you have not yet submitted your Installation Report into Malta OR send it to Kasey (you have the option to do either method), you must get it in ASAP. National requires the Installation reports to be submitted by June 30. Without the Installation report, your Auxiliary will be subject to suspension per the Bylaws.

Item #4: Malta: Malta will be closed until at least July 8, 2019, for the year-end processing by National Headquarters. It will be posted to our social media and on the website when it reopens.

Item #5: District Meetings: District Meetings will be held in July. Please note the schedule in this mailing. Many Districts have changed their meeting days to accommodate the National Convention.

Item #6: National Convention: The VFW and VFW Auxiliary National Convention will be held July 20-24 in Orlando, Florida. We hope to see many members from Indiana at this special event. Please note that the Department Office for the Auxiliary will be closed from July 18-27, 2019 due to National Convention.

Item #7: All Auxiliary Officers: Please pay your membership dues if you are an annual member as soon as possible. This is just a simple reminder as National requires your membership to be paid to maintain your office.

Items #8: Bonds: Bonds will expire on August 31, 2019. Please renew your bond as soon as possible via Malta. If you do not use Malta, the Bond applications will be sent out in August's mailing of General Orders (as soon as we have it available from National HQ).

Item #9: School of Instruction: The dates for School of Instruction are August 16 and 17 at the Indianapolis Marriott East. Please see this mailing for the schedule of events. There will be important seminars for all members, but special attention will be paid to Presidents, Secretaries, Treasurers, Trustees, and of course, the programs for the year.

Item #10: Auxiliary Treasurers: Do not hold dues. Please utilize MALTA for dues transmittals. This is important not only for the effective and efficient processing of dues but to also have real time stats for your membership. If you do not use Malta, please send your dues to Kasey Osborn. As always, please remember that there is a newsletter included in this General Orders specifically for you.

Item #11: Audits: Audits are technically due by July 31. As always, a grace period will be allowed into August to allow you to have time to vote on them in a meeting.

Item #12: Roster Books and Changes: Roster books should be distributed at the School of Instructions. Please send any roster changes to Kasey Osborn for the next month's mailing of General Orders.

Item #13: Auxiliary Presidents: By now, you should have appointed all your program chairmen. If you have not done so, please do this immediately so that you can begin to be successful with programs this year.

Item #14: Electronic Communications: If you receive General Orders via US Mail in hard copy format and are able to receive them electronically instead, please notify Kasey ASAP. Also, please note that General Orders are posted to our website at www.vfwauxin.org under resources. The electronic format is posted instantly the same day the hard copy goes out in the US Mail. You can also sign up for General Orders to be emailed to you even if you are not an Officer. Further, all guide sheets and report forms as they become available will be posted under the programs section of the website. Feel free to check the website often for new information!

Item #15: T-shirts, Hats, and Pins: The 2019-2020 shirts, hats, and pins are now available for purchase. Please use the T-Shirt Order Form in this mailing to order your shirts and hats. Find the enclosed pin flyer for pin orders to pick up at School of Instruction. At the Department Convention, the C of A voted to allow us to accept Credit Card payments for shirts and hats from individual members. There will be a \$3.00 fee added to your total transaction if you use a Credit/Debit card.

Welcome to a new and exciting year! June was pretty calm, like the calm before the storm. Let's hit this head on! You can begin to send me new member apps and such on July 1, 2019. When Malta opens back up, you can start to enter your 2020 dues for continuous members. I can't wait to watch your numbers grow!

Here's some tips to start the year:

- 1. Go into Malta as soon as it opens and purchase your bond. Once the money processes in a few days, you will be able to print your bond.
- 2. Put up a flyer, send it in your Auxiliary newsletter, or however you communicate with your members: Ask them to remember that if they change any of their contact information to get it to you or the Secretary so that Malta can be updated. Members often forget to notify the Auxiliary of any changes when the move.

- 4. Don't forget, when sending memberships to me, I do NOT have the authorization to ACH your bank. You must send me a check for the dues amount.
- 5. Please make sure that any apps you send me are legible. If they are not, I will send them back to you for clarification. I have had to purchase too many cards out of my own pocket because I had to guess on names (and guessed wrong) and many times the Treasurer didn't know for sure either.
- 6. If you are a new Treasurer, please make sure you fill out the IRS form 8822-B that was sent out in last month's mailing. If you did not get it, forms will be available at School of Instruction and on the IRS website.
- 7. Please be at School of Instruction on August 16 and 17. We will begin training at 7:15 for the Treasurers and Trustees. We will do Trustees from 7:15 to around 7:45.

The St. Joseph Cemetery is proud to announce that it been selected to be a host of *The Wall That Heals*, a ³/₄ scaled replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial. The Wall will be on display at the Cemetery (25751 Grant Road, South Bend, IN 46619) along with the mobile Education Center September 19th through September 22, 2019.

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial is one of the most visited memorials in our nation's capital, however, many Americans have not been able to visit what has become known to many as "The Wall." Any money raised in excess of direct expenses for this event shall be donated to establishing a monument and park area dedicated to Vietnam Veterans within the cemetery. St. Joseph Cemetery will not be keeping any money raised for this event for any other purpose.

For those who are <u>NEW</u> and may not know me I am Jean Haggard. I joined the Auxiliary in 1966 at the age of 17 in the now defunct Auxiliary of Post 2552 in Franklin under my brother David Lee Rogers. Even before I joined my step-father was commander of the Post and he believed it was our patriotic duty to support our servicemen, our community and our family. We traveled to many district meetings (back then they were held on Saturday and we could party afterwards), marched in parades for the community, attended dances at other Posts and met with many others who felt the same way. One of my fondest memories was at the Ernie Pyle Post in Indianapolis. They had a spoon dance for kids on Friday ("Tiny" was my partner) and then Saturday was meant for the adults. Every Sunday we spent hours cleaning our Post. This is from The American Heritage Dictionary:

Most all of <u>you</u> know about the Buddy Poppywhere it started, who makes them, who benefits from the sale of them and the distribution of them.... And so on....but does your fellow VFW Comrades, VFW Auxiliary members or the general public???? The focus of Buddy Poppy program this year is to educate others about the Buddy Poppy and the work that little crepe paper flower does to help so many!

For starters, you need supplies:

- 1. Auxiliaries can order Buddy Poppies direct from VFW Dept of Indiana Headquarters. You do not have to order them through your POST. Allow enough time, 6-8 weeks, before you need them for your event or Buddy Poppy drives. An order form can be obtained on their website www.vfwin.org.
- 2. Buddy Poppy supplies such as pamphlets, posters, bookmarks, etc. can be ordered from the VFW Store for distribution with the actual flower itself.

Buddy Poppies are trademarked as the official Memorial Flower of the VFW to remember the fallen by honoring the living. Why trademark Buddy? From the VFW webpage: The VFW made that trademark a guarantee that all poppies bearing that name and the VFW label are genuine products of the work of disabled and needy veterans. No other organization, firm or individual can legally use the name Buddy Poppy. Still today, our Buddy Poppies are still assembled by disabled and needy veterans in VA Hospitals.

Do you know, that for every Buddy Poppy sold by the VFW:

- Part goes to VFW National Headquarters Veteran Service Fund
 - Part goes to VFW Department of IN Veteran Service Funds
 - Part goes to the VFW National Home for Children

Buddy Poppies should be visable throughout the community all year long. Be sure to incorporate them in all of the other 10 VFW Auxiliary programs. Don't forget to report using them especially on your BUDDY POPPY report!!!
