TO BE READ AT MEETINGS AND POSTED

- 1. **District and Post Bond** from the Department through National expired 31 August 2025. If you have not already renewed, the application for bond renewal is attached to these General Orders. Also attached is information on bonds for canteen personnel. <u>All Bond requests must have an application along with payment</u>.
- 2. **Attention to all members** is directed to the purposes listed within the VFW's Congressional Charter. "To maintain and extend the institutions of American freedom" is one the VFW's chartered purposes: as such the VFW represents fighting for American rights, civil rights and humanitarian impulses that have always guided the VFW's principles.

Today the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States reaffirms its commitment to that chartered purpose by first recognizing that to end racism within our organization, it is not enough to be non-racist/non-discriminatory: we must be proactive. While we focus on education and mentorship we work to identify, address, and eradicate all forms of racial bias and discrimination. We will work to eliminate racial injustices and discriminatory practices within our organization. The VFW's leadership is united in the pursuit of ending racial bias and discrimination while empowering our members and the greater veteran community towards this collective goal.

- 3. **Every Post** chartered by the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States will be expected to participate in the following programs during the 2025-2026 year: Voice of Democracy, Patriots Pen, Buddy Poppy (500 minimum) and Veterans and Military Support Programs (VMS). Additionally, it is necessary that all Post and District Commanders comply with all provisions of the National Bylaws and the Manual of Procedure and Ritual.
- 4. To qualify for All-American, a minimum donation of \$125.00 must be donated to VMS by 30 June 2026. VMS donations will only be handled through the Dashboard. All Posts must click on the "VMS Donation" tab on the Dashboard to donate. This link will point them to OMS. Please do not send checks to the National Headquarters. If a Post does not use a credit card, the Post will send their donation to the Department HQs, and the Department HQs will submit the donation for their Post. Credit will automatically update on the Dashboard daily.

- 5. State Headquarters will be closed on 1 September 2025 to observe Labor Day.
- 6. **The Council of Administration Meeting** will be on Friday, 5 September 2025 at 6pm Marriott East. Uniform State Shirts and slacks/khakis.
- 7. **The School of Instruction** will be on Saturday, 6 September 2025 at Marriott East. Registration is 6 September from 8:00am 9:00am. School starts promptly at 9:00am. Uniform is State Shirts and shorts, jeans, or slacks. No covers.
- 8. **POW/MIA Ceremony** will be at the Indiana War Memorial Pershing Auditorium, 19 September 2025, from 11:30am 1:00pm. Uniform is State Shirts and slacks, Jacket and Ties optional.
- 9. **Indiana Day** at the VFW National Home in Eaton Rapids, Michigan is 21 September 2025. Uniform is State Shirts, shorts, jeans, or slacks.

Questionnaire for VFW Accountable Officers Crime Coverage

Dear Comrade Commander:

August 1, 2025

One of the most important communications you will receive during the year concerns appropriate bonding of your Post Positions. Section 703 of the National By-Laws requires that each Accountable Officer shall be bonded with an Indemnity Company as surety. The By-Laws place the responsibility for adequate bonding upon the Commander of the post. Section 218 of the National Manual requires THE BOOKS AND RECORDS OF THE ACCOUNTABLE OFFICER BE AUDITED AT LEAST QUARTERLY BY THE TRUSTEES.

The Department Headquarters carries a Crime Policy for the bonding of Department and Post Accountable Officers. Any unit may decide whether it prefers to take out a policy with another surety company or have its funds protected by the Department Headquarters Crime Policy. However, prompt attention is required because if your Accountable Officers had previously been covered through the Department Program, a new premium payment is required by September 1, 2025 or it will be considered delinquent.

COVERAGES OF THE POLICY REQUIRE:

- 1. You agree to make/or cause to be made, at least annually, an audit of your books and accounts, including complete verification of all securities and bank balances pertaining to each "employee and/ or volunteer".
- If the above is not complied with, the Insurance Company may refuse to honor claim of missing funds which cannot be proven by records. Monthly audits and reconciliation of bank statements may avoid this denial of claim.
- 2. The Insurance Company may not pay for loss resulting from any unauthorized advances made by an "employee" to any member for delinquent dues and assessments.
- "Employee" means any duly elected position, or any appointed officer as listed in the policy schedule.
- 4. IF THE POLICY IS NOT RENEWED, TERMINATED, OR CANCELLED AT EXPIRATION DATE OF 9-1-2025, THE POST HAS ONLY 90 DAYS TO SUBMIT A PROOF OF LOSS FOR PRIOR TERM. AFTER 90 DAYS PRIOR COVERAGE CEASES.
- 5. POST MUST SUBMIT A PROOF OF LOSS FORM WITHIN 120 DAYS FROM THE FIRST DATE OF DISCOVERY OF THE LOSS.

THIS POLICY IS ONLY FOR THE YEAR SEPTEMBER 1, 2025 TO SEPTEMBER 1, 2026

The funds of your Post are protected only for that year. Premium for the following year will be due September 1, 2026





Chili/Soup Cook-Off Rules and Regulations

Friday October 3rd, 2025

The following rules are to be adhered to by all cook-off cooks, judges and/or assistants:

- 1. Soup is defined as a liquid food especially with a meat, fish, or vegetable stock as a base and often containing pieces of solid food. Soups are either clear varieties based on broths and prepared stocks, or thick soups which are emulsified with starches and dairy products to give them more body; BOTH WILL BE ACCEPTED FOR THIS COMPETITION.
- 2. There is no entry fee. Contestants may enter more than 1 batch of chili and/or soup. There will be People's Choice prizes.
- 3. Cooks agree to provide a thorough ingredient list (not recipe) to prevent allergic reactions and/or anaphylactic shock.
- 4. Chili and/or Soup is to be brought "ready-to-eat" in a crock pot.
- 5. Contestants are responsible for supplying all of their own utensils and products relating to their chili and/or Soup submission and maintenance of its proper temperature for serving. Spoons and bowls for use in serving chili to the general public will be provided.
- 6. The shelter house kitchen is off limits with the exception of the use of the kitchen sink. All food prep will be conducted at the camp site. The shelter house common area may be used as it has plenty of room and outlets for your entires crockpot.
- 7. Entries will need to be in place at 4:50 PM so that judging/sampling of the entries will begin at 5:00 PM.
- 8. Each contestant will be assigned a "contestant number" by the Cook-Off Master. This number will be used by the "judges" to score their favorites. Each 1st Place vote will be awarded 3 points, each 2nd place vote will be awarded 2 points and each 3rd place vote will be awarded 1 point. The entry with the most points will be awarded 1st place, followed by 2nd place and 3rd place. and be given a container in which their soup will be collected at the time of the official judging. The decision of the judges is final.


