TO BE READ AT MEETINGS AND POSTED:

- 1. State Convention: Is June 12-13th at Marriott East. The 12th will be the C of A in the evening at 7pm, and registration in the afternoon for those arriving for the Saturday events. Saturday the 13th is the Convention: Beginning at 0800-1100 will be registration. 0900-1200 will be business meetings, a break for lunch offsite (bring food as needed), Business and elections will continue at 1:00, and conclude in the early evening. Be advised there are no speakers, no banquet, no hospitality rooms. The purpose is to expedite completion of business, and begin the new installation to have all officers in place by close of business. Post members are to contact the Marriott at this link to book a room if so desired to stay the night on the 12th for business on the 13th: https://book.passkey.com/e/50035614. Additionally, you may call their number at 317-352-1231 for personal booking. Be advised, we are still standing by on words from the Governor's office regarding the number of people permitted to occupy the space, so please be cognizant of taking care of your personal health and personal protective equipment (PPE). PPE will not be given out during convention, so please bring your own if you so desire.
- 2. Elections and Documents: Remember, all posts and districts must have their audit reports, election reports and delegate list and fees completed to participate. Documents need to be received at HQ no later than 8 June. (That means they must be in the Adjutant's hands by 4 pm on 8 June). Late documents will not be accepted. All responsibilities of Department, District, and Post leadership include access to the OMS and Dashboard to perform the duties expected therein. This especially affects Commanders, Quartermasters, and Adjutants. All duties of obligation require this site to be successful. Tutorials abound on the site, and are neither difficult nor long.
- 4. Headquarters will be reaching out for a Front Desk Receptionist in the future, after meeting to revise expectations and financial elements with the finance committee as proper protocol is observed.

Application for VFW Accountable Officers Crime Coverage

August 1, 2020

One of the most important communications you will receive during the year concerns the bond of your Unit Quartermaster. Section 703 of our National By-Laws requires that each accountable officer shall be bonded with an Indemnity Company as surety and the By-Laws places the responsibility for adequate bonding upon the Commander of the post. In any business it is customary to bond any officer handling funds. THE BOOKS AND RECORDS OF THE ACCOUNTABLE OFFICER MUST BE AUDITED AT LEAST QUARTERLY BY THE TRUSTEES. THIS IS TO COMPLY WITH SECTION 218 OF THE NATIONAL MANUAL OF PROCEDURES.

The Department Headquarters carries a schedule bond for the bonding of Department and Post Accountable Officers. This bond runs for a year – from September 1 to August 31 – premium payments are made on that basis. All bonds expire on August 31 and premium for New Year is due on September 1.

Any unit may decide whether it prefers to take out a bond with some other surety company or have its funds protected by the Department Headquarters schedule bond. But the matter should be given prompt attention because if your Accountable Officer had previously been bonded through the National Headquarters, a new premium payment is required by September 1, 2019 and delinquent after this date.

IF BOND IS NOT RENEWED, TERMINATED, OR CANCELLED AT EXPIRATION DATE OF 9-1-2020, THE POST HAS ONLY 90 DAYS TO SUBMIT A PROOF OF LOSS FOR PRIOR TERM, AFTER 90 DAYS PRIOR COVERAGE CEASES.

COVERAGES OF THE POLICY REQUIRE THAT:

- 1. You agree to make/or cause to be made, at least annually, an audit of your books and accounts, including complete verification of all securities and bank balances pertaining to each "employee and/ or volunteer".
 - If the above is not complied with, the Surety Company will refuse to honor claim of missing funds which cannot be proven by records. Monthly audits and reconciliation of bank statements may avoid this denial of claim.
- 2. The Surety Company will not pay for loss resulting from any unauthorized advances made by an "employee" to any member for delinquent dues and assessments.
- 3. "Employee" means any duly elected position or any appointed officer as listed in the policy schedule.
- 4. POST MUST SUBMIT A PROOF OF LOSS FORM WITHIN 120 DAYS FROM THE FIRST DATE OF DISCOVERY OF THE LOSS. Proof of loss resulting from dishonest acts on the part of the bonded officer is required in settlement of claims.

THIS BOND IS ONLY FOR THE YEAR SEPTEMBER 1, 2020 TO AUGUST 31, 2021.

The funds of your Post are protected only for that year. Premium for the following year will be due September 1, 2021.







'Just Put on Your Freaking Mask and Shut the Hell Up,' Says Southern Restaurant Owner More than a million veterans who served this great nation struggle to make ends meet. Worse yet, tens of thousands of them are living on the streets homeless, and thousands more are constantly at risk of losing their homes. Many of them fail to receive the proper health care they deserve. This tragedy should be a top priority for our nation's lawmakers. However, too many politicians today seem more concerned about offering handouts to illegal aliens who have no legal right to be in this country than they are about the plight of America's heroes: Our Veterans.

Sadly, more than 37,000 veterans in the United States are homeless, according to a recent <u>report</u> by the Federation for American Immigration Reform (FAIR). More than a quarter of them – nearly 11,000 – belong to the sanctuary state of California, with other sanctuary jurisdictions like Washington and New York harboring thousands more.

meaning they are struggling to provide for themselves and their families. Included in that figure are 27 percent of the men and women who fought in Iraq and Afghanistan and now aren't even sure how they will put food on their tables. Meanwhile, 7 million illegal aliens are working in jobs that should belong to these veterans and other Americans. That should anger any American who understands the sacrifice veterans made for this country.

Unfortunately, many of this nation's elected officials seem completely unaware and/or unbothered by the plight of our nation's heroes. In fact, their actions have made the situation worse. Rather than support veterans with financial aid until they get back on their feet or provide them with training programs to prepare them for the workforce, elected officials in sanctuary jurisdictions like California have spent millions of dollars ensuring that illegal aliens feel safe and comfortable in the United States and have free access to legal services when they need to fight deportation.

For example, elected officials in Oakland created a \$300,000 fund to protect illegal aliens from federal law enforcement in 2018. Los Angeles has an even larger program that has spent approximately \$7 million so far. The Golden State has the largest number of homeless veterans in the nation. But rather than do something about the problem, elected officials are funneling millions of dollars to illegal aliens while ignoring their homeless and underserved veterans.

California, in fact, has become the nation's case study in how to not treat your veterans. Veterans often wait several months before receiving the proper medical care that they deserve. The veterans living in San Jose wait an average of 50 days before receiving vital treatment at a primary care Veterans Affairs clinic, and the wait time in other areas can be almost twice as long. How did California's elected officials react to this problem? They passed a law last year to provide health insurance for illegal aliens between the ages of 19 and 25, which is expected to cost taxpayers nearly \$100 million in the first year alone.

With just the money California is allocating to illegal alien health insurance, the state's elected officials could give every single homeless veteran nearly \$10,000 per year. That kind of money could go a long way toward fully eliminating the Golden State's homeless veteran epidemic.

Other states have also copied California's playbook. In Maryland's Montgomery County, a proud sanctuary jurisdiction, elected officials created a similar \$370,000 fund to protect their local illegal alien population from federal law enforcement in 2018. Despite the fact that at least eight illegal aliens were accused of rape within the span of a month last year, the county continues to provide free legal services to illegal aliens while refusing to hand over those who should be removed to federal officials.

Overall, the United States spends a total of \$132 billion every year providing goods and services to illegal aliens. At that price tag, you could make every homeless veteran in the United States a millionaire! It's a shame that many of this nation's leaders spend more effort ensuring that illegal aliens feel comfortable breaking the law than they do providing basic services and aid to the veterans who risked their lives defending our freedom. When the United States has more than a million veterans struggling to put food on their table and tens of thousands remaining homeless, there is a real crisis on our hands. It's far past time for our elected officials to realize this and act now before it's too late.
