GENERAL ORDERS #5

1 November 2018 2018-19 Series

TO BE READ AT MEETINGS AND POSTED:

- Annual members are reminded that dues expire on the last day their anniversary month. Annual members are encouraged to renew their dues prior to their anniversary date to avoid a lapse in continuous membership.
- 2. Officers and committee members, whose membership is not in good standing by reason failing to pay current dues by their anniversary date, shall be removed from office and forfeit eligibility to hold any office for the remainder of the administrative year.
- 3. Members are reminded that their annual membership in the Veterans of Foreign Wars has been changed to a 12-month dues structure that started July 1, 2018. The changes to subscription dues to a "DMV" model now allows anyone who becomes a member or renews membership after July 1, 2018, to postpone expiration until the last day of their 12th month. For example, if a new member joins or an existing member renews on July 5, 2018, their dues now expire on July 31, 2019. The annual membership card (effective July 1, 2018) reflects the month and year dues expire.

Current members that are in good standing as of July 1, 2018, have been extended in OMS through the last day of the month when their dues are scheduled to expire. Regardless of the month they renewed, as long as they were in good standing as of July 1, 2018, they now have until the end of the expiration month to renew their dues.

Members that are in good standing but have not renewed for the 2018/19 membership year will see the changes on their digital ID card reflecting the updated month and year when their dues expire. They will have the option to request an updated annual membership card with the change reflecting the expiration month and year.

The purpose of the changes to subscription dues to a "DMV" model was to streamline the process for both the Post and Department Quartermasters to track expiring annual members. No longer will Posts and Departments have to chase annual members' dues on a daily basis; instead they can see a block of members during a specific month (one, two and three months out), allowing them to formulate a plan to collect dues at one time. This also makes it easier for the Department/District/Post Sergeant-at-Arms to quickly see if a member is in good standing prior to a meeting.

- 4. Attention of Post Commanders is directed to Section 218 of the Manual of Procedure, "Duty of Trustees." Trustees Report of Audit must be completed in detail at the close of each quarter, one of which ends December 31, 2018. Commanders are reminded that accurate and complete records shall be kept by all persons handling Post funds, including the Club Manager, Bingo Chairman and VFW Riders Groups. These records shall be audited by Post Trustees in the same manner as Post Quartermaster and Adjutant records.
- 5. A thorough program of Post inspection is necessary to ensure compliance with National and Department Bylaws and directives. District and Department Inspectors to include Assistant Inspectors shall make every effort to inspect every Post under their cognizance on an annual basis and correct such discrepancies as may be disclosed.
- 6. Recent changes to the VFW National Bylaws, Manual of Procedure and Ritual establish that *Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised* shall be the parliamentary authority on procedural matters not governed by VFW Bylaws and Manual of Procedure. Newly revised *Robert's Rules of Order* is readily available at local book stores and online retailers such as Barnes & Noble and Amazon.
- 7. The VFW Department of Indiana does have a telephone telemarketer. If you receive a call and are unsure that the solicitation is legit please call State Headquarters.
- 8. State HQ will be closed 22 & 23 November to observe the Thanksgiving Holiday.
- 9. Posts and Districts on a July 1 June 30 fiscal year should file the proper federal (990) and state tax forms not later than 15 November 2017.
- 10. Post Quartermasters are referred to IRS Publication 3386, Tax Guide Veterans. Organizations, for information and help completing 990 forms etc.
- 11. Commanders at all levels are directed to Section 1001 (25.) of the National Manual of Procedure that states: The presence, dispensation, and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages in VFW meeting rooms during VFW meetings is unacceptable and is prohibited.
- 12. Several important documents are attached to these orders. Please review all.

At close of business on November 30, the Post in each membership division that shows the highest increase in new and reinstated percentage (the N/R% column in Memstats) for the month of November (comparing 11/1 to 11/30) will receive an award of \$500 to be deposited directly into their Post fund to be used as needed for the Post. To check on your status at any time, login to OMS and click on Commander Challenge under the Reporting Tab. It's time to focus on recruiting and retention; let's MAKE IT HAPPEN!
- 5. Make Sure Your Voice is Heard on Nov. 6. The VFW encourages all its members and supporters to get involved with the upcoming elections. With continued threat of sequestration, deficit reduction, and budget cuts that affect veterans, the military, and their families, it is important to support members of Congress who support us. Ways to get involved may include: registering to vote and encouraging others to register; setting up or volunteering at voter registration drives; hosting or attending town hall meetings or candidate forums and bringing up VFW priorities; helping the elderly and disabled get to the voting booth on Election Day; and voting on Nov. 6.
- 6. WALGREENS NO-COST FLU SHOTS NOW AVAILABLE Be prepared for the upcoming cold and flu season! Now through March 31, 2019, all VA-enrolled veterans are eligible for free annual flu shots at their local Walgreens or Duane Reade pharmacy. While this immunization program is limited to VA patients, Walgreens offers flu shots to most VFW members and their families through other coverage programs, such as TRICARE, Medicare and many health care plans.
- 7. VFW FOUNDATION COMMUNITY SUPPORT GRANT The VFW Foundation Community Support Grant is open. Qualified Posts and/or Auxiliaries may receive grants of up to \$1,000 to support local nonprofits or important outreach projects in their communities. New to the grant this year, an applicant may be eligible to receive up to \$500 in additional funding by organizing a community service project that involves a local branch or affiliate of a VFW national corporate supporter (e.g. Burger King, Sport Clips, Walgreens, Humana, Ace Hardware, etc.). Please do the same for any Veterans Day activity you may be participating in this year. Wear your cover proudly as you have earned the title of Veteran. If you are travelling for either Veterans Day or Thanksgiving festivities, please take your time and travel safely.

November is Men's Health Awareness month. There are a growing number of websites, information, and activities people participate in to bring awareness of men's health issues. Prostate and testicular cancer, mental health issues, and suicide are all issues being faced today by men and need to be discussed and addressed. Thank you for all you do on a day in day out basis for the VFW. Veterans Sticking Together is what we do. Do not hesitate to reach out to your Post Commander, your District Commander, or your Department line officers if you need assistance. Thank you again for all you do for our Veterans and for the Department of Indiana and for the VFW.

Beneficiary Travel

care, or VA authorized non-VA healthcare for which the Veteran is eligible. fhe Beneficiary Travel (BT) program provides eligible Veterans and other (ambulance, wheelchair van) transport for travel to and from VA health beneficiaries mileage reimbursement, common carrier (plane, train, ous, taxi, light rail etc.), or when medically indicated, "special mode"

Beneficiary Travel Eligibility:

To qualify for beneficiary travel reimbursement, you must meet one or more of the following:

- A service connected rating of 30% or more, or
- Traveling for treatment of any SC condition, or
- Receive a VA pension, or
- Income is below the
- Maximum annual VA pension rate, or
- » Traveling for a scheduled Compensation and Pension claim.

General Travel:

- \$0.415 (41.5 cents) per mile.
- Scheduled appointments qualify for round-trip mileage.
- Unscheduled visits (Walk-ins) may be limited to return mileage only.
- If carpooling with other Veterans to your appointment, only one person in the vehicle will be eligible for BT reimbursement. Typically, the driver that incurred the costs.
- If using Veteran Transportation Service (VTS), Volunteer Transportation Network (VTN), or any other VA funded transportation service, then you are not eligible for BT reimbursement.

Common Carrier and Special Mode:

- A common carrier is any transportation service that is open to the public, i.e. trains, taxis, and buses that do not require any special accommodations for use.
- appointment, then you may be eligible for a reimbursement for the cost of the transportation. If you are eligible for beneficiary travel and use a common carrier to reach your VA funded
- If you are unable to transport via a common carrier due to your medical conditions, you may qualify for a special mode of transport. Talk to your Primary Care Provider to see if you qualify for a Special Mode Transportation Consult.
- Submitting a claim for BT reimbursement is quick and easy.
