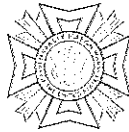

TO BE READ AT MEETINGS AND POSTED:

1. **Attention is directed to Section 213 of the National By-Laws**, concerning any Post in arrears for any financial obligations to County Council (if applicable), District, Department and National for fees, dues, poppy money, supply money, failing to have the office of the Quartermaster properly bonded in accordance with Section 703, failing to ensure that the Post is properly insured in accordance with Section 709, failing to submit properly completed quarterly Post Trustees Report of Audit, Post-Election Report for the ensuing year, or other obligations, shall be deprived of all representation in District meetings, County Council meetings (if applicable), District, Department and National Conventions. Such representation shall be restored promptly upon proper adjustment of such deficiencies.

2. **All officers** are encouraged to make every effort to renew the membership every continuous member prior to their expiration. Reports showing members 30, 60, and 90 days from expiration can be obtained by the Post Quartermaster through the Online Membership System (OMS).

3. **Officers** who are annual members and fail to renew prior to their expiration date will be relieved of their officer position per section 215, 415, or 515 of the National By-Laws.

4. **January 2021 District Meetings.** Schedules are attached to these General Orders.

5. **Per Section 216, Manual of Procedure**, the Post Trustee's Report of Audit for the quarter ending 31 December 2020 is due to the State Headquarters **not later than** 31 January 2021.



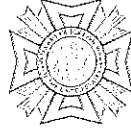

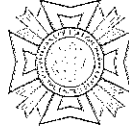

VA Community Emergency Care Information for Veterans

In most instances, Veterans are eligible to receive Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)-authorized emergency care at an in-network facility if VA is notified of the emergent event within 72 hours. The VA medical center (VAMC) nearest to a Veteran's emergent event can identify in-network emergency care providers.

Veterans do not need to check with VA before going to an emergency department in the community or calling an ambulance. During a medical emergency, VA encourages all Veterans to seek immediate medical attention without delay.

To simplify and streamline this emergency care notification process, VA established a national emergency care contact center.

The Emergency Care Centralized Notification Center allows community providers to report instances of a Veteran presenting to a community emergency department. It offers simplified access to VA for care coordination, eligibility determination and payment authorization information. Centralized notification standardizes communication, documentation and collaboration between VA and community providers.

General Information

VA should be notified within 72 hours of the start of an emergent event that a Veteran has sought emergency care at an in-network facility. This notification ensures VA can authorize the care. This step also assists VA in coordinating the Veteran's transfer to a VAMC and additional care, and ensures that the requirements for VA to pay for the care are met.

For each emergent episode of care, treating community providers will receive authorization decision information and, if applicable, directions on how to submit claims. Failure to notify VA of care rendered through an in-network community facility prevents VA from authorizing the emergency treatment and prevents claims and payments from being made through one of VA's third-party administrators.

Notification Requirements

The person notifying VA should be prepared to supply case-specific information, as seen below.

This information is explained in VA Form 10-10143g, Non-VA Hospital Emergency Notification, available online at https://www.va.gov/vaforms/medical/pdf/10-10143g_Non-VA_Hospital_Emergency_Notification_Fill.pdf.

Case-specific details are necessary for care coordination and eligibility determination. If the person notifying VA is unable to supply all necessary information, VA will contact the appropriate parties to collect the information.

Providers should use one of the following centralized options to notify VA with details about Veterans receiving emergent care in the community:

1. Email: VHAEmergencyNotification@va.gov
2. Phone: 844-72HRVHA (844-724-7842)

If notification is made to a local VA medical facility the notification will be referred to the centralized intake for action.

If you ask me those are some pretty impressive numbers considering almost half of that was during the worst pandemic the modern world has every saw!

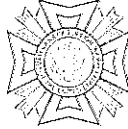

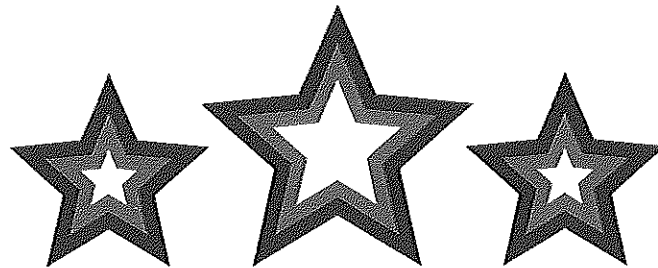

FY2021 VFW POST PANDEMIC RELIEF GRANT

Eligibility Requirement Updates – December 2020

PURPOSE

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, VFW Posts have been severely impacted in their ability to cover operating expenses through conventional means such as canteen sales and fundraising events. To address the challenge, in August 2020 the VFW Foundation earmarked \$680,000 for the **VFW Foundation Post Pandemic Relief Grant (PPRG)**. Eligible Posts that own or lease their own Post Homes may apply for a grant of up to \$2,500.

As of December 10, 2020, nearly \$350,000 has been approved for PPRG support to 140+ VFW Posts. At its December 14, 2020, meeting the VFW Foundation board of directors approved changes in PPRG eligibility requirements to allow additional VFW Posts to qualify for assistance.

ELIGIBILITY (updates in RED type):

- Have completed any two out of the five following criteria during the **2018-2019 and/or 2019-2020** fiscal year:
 1. Achieved 100% membership.
 2. Submission of Voice of Democracy, Patriots Pen, and/or Teacher of the Year
 3. Buddy Poppies purchased
 4. Donation made to Veterans & Military Support Programs
 5. Reported 1,000 or more hours of community service to their Department
- Be in good standing (i.e. not on suspension) with VFW National.
- Own or rent a Post Home. The title deed or lease agreement must be held by members of the VFW Post and cannot be jointly owned or rented by any other veterans' group(s).
- Have a fully completed Election Report on file with VFW National Headquarters.
- Have a combined total of less than \$25,000 in all non-restricted bank accounts held by the Post. Federal Payroll Protection Program grants are considered restricted funds and need not be counted when calculating the total amount in non-restricted accounts.
- Agree to complete and return a two-page grant report form along with proof of how the funding was used.
- Have a qualifying need, which includes payment assistance for the following:
 - Mortgage/Rent
 - Utilities (gas, electric, water, etc.)
 - Insurance
 - Property tax
 - Post home building repairs
 - Costs associated with bringing the Post building and personnel into compliance with Covid-19 safety regulations (e.g. cleaning/sanitizing, personal protective equipment (PPE), shields/sneeze guards, etc.)

VFW FOUNDATION

Crowdfunding and VFW's Solicitation of Funds

Background

The Manual of Procedure, at Sections 214, 414, and 514, (MOP) retains the general rule that precludes traditional solicitation outside of immediate geographic boundaries. An exception was created to allow Posts, Districts, and Departments to engage in web-based solicitation (crowdfunding) provided it is temporary. This change was made in 2016 in response to numerous complaints by members describing the difficulties encountered in raising the necessary funds for Posts. The challenge in addressing these complaints was to balance the need to allow for web-based fundraising with the traditional restrictions on ensuring various entities fundraise within their respective geographic areas. The intent of the change was to expand the geographic areas for web-based fundraising while keeping in place the restrictions for traditional fundraising activities.

Rule

The MOP precludes web-based fundraising that is "repetitive or ongoing." That is, the need to engage in web-based fundraising should be in response to a temporary need. Once that need is addressed, the crowdfunding solicitation should be discontinued. The rationale behind this is that, with the growth of web-based fundraising platforms, Posts, Districts, and Departments were being disadvantaged in terms of competing with other non-VFW entities for funds. Under the current MOP, a Post can raise funds using a crowdfunding platform for a particular need, such as repairing the Post's roof or providing funds to assist an immediate need for an area veteran. Once that need is resolved, it is expected that the web-based solicitation would be removed (i.e., it is not ongoing).

Charitable Solicitation Laws

This is allowed as long as it does not violate applicable charitable solicitations laws. As with any fundraising activity, Posts, Districts, and Departments need to know the laws that regulate fundraising. The laws vary from state to state. In the majority of states, there are laws that require charitable nonprofits to register with the state before soliciting residents in their state. With crowdfunding, the regulations reach beyond the originating state and extend to the state in which funds are requested (which is world-wide with web-based fundraising). For example, an online crowdfunding event for a charity based in Florida that is viewed by the residents of New York could require charitable registration in New York. The failure to register can result in both civil and criminal penalties and, again, vary among the states. Potential penalties include state fines, requiring the nonprofit to return all solicited funds or ordering the nonprofit to cease soliciting donations within the state until registration is completed.

The "repetitive or ongoing" standard reflected in the MOP was derived from a group of state attorney's general and state charitable solicitation officials who recognized that the burdensome registration process would apply if the solicitation is ongoing or repetitive. This standard is viewed against various other factors to determine whether the state will enforce its charitable solicitation laws. In short, states generally will not pursue an action against a charity that engages in a temporary on-line fundraiser.

Other Considerations

That said, the Bylaws and MOP allow for it, with the caveat that state laws must be followed. In addition to an evaluation of the charitable solicitation laws, when deciding to use a fundraising platform website, a Posts, Districts, and Departments should research other issues, including:

- What fees will the website deduct from each contribution?
- Will the donors' information be provided?
- How will the website use a charity's donors' information? Is a privacy policy in place?
- When will contributions be deposited into a charity's bank account/mailed to the charity?
- What steps are being taken by the website to prevent solicitation fraud?
- What kind of accounting will the website provide to a charity?

Conclusion

Fundraising through web-based platforms (crowdfunding) is authorized under the Bylaws and Manual of Procedure. Crowdfunding can be a useful way for Posts, Districts, and Departments to raise funds, but those entities should be aware of potential associated legal risks. These risks were explained when the changes were made to the MOP. The decision to adopt the changes in 2016 indicates a willingness for these entities to accept the risks.

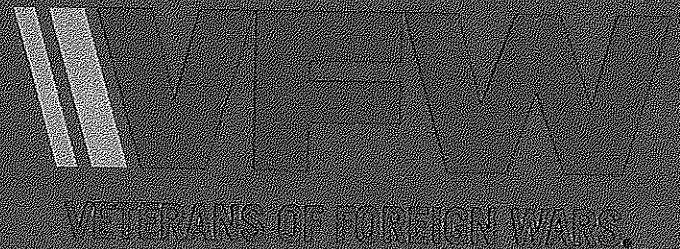
