TO BE READ AT MEETINGS AND POSTED:

1. **The State Headquarters will be closed** Monday, 15 January 2024 to observe Martin Luther King Jr. Day.

2. **Commanders on all levels** are reminded that according to Section 105 of the National By-Laws, a member whose dues are unpaid after their anniversary date ceases to be a member in good standing and loses all rights of membership in the Veterans of Foreign Wars. They shall not attend meetings or conventions and shall not participate in Post, County Council, District, Department or National functions.

3. **The attention of Department, District, County Council and Post Commanders** is directed to Section 103 of the Manual of Procedure, which prescribes the manner in which applications for membership will be handled. Applications for membership of new, reinstated or transfer members must be voted on by the members present at a regular Post meeting.

4. **Per Section 216, Manual of Procedure**, the Post Trustee's Report of Audit for the quarter ending 31 December 2023 is due to the State Adjutant **not later than 31 January 2024**.

5. **January 2024 District Meetings**. Schedule is attached to these General Orders.

6. **Military Veterans Legislative Day at the State House** will be on Tuesday, 16 January 2023, in the south atrium, second floor of the Indiana State Capitol located at 200 S. Capitol Ave., Indianapolis, IN. The overall event is intended to open communication channels between Indiana Reserve Components, active-duty military members and military veterans and families with their Indiana State Senators and Representatives regarding military and veteran specific legislation moving through the Indiana General Assembly during the 2024 legislative session. 7. **Cocktails with Commander** will be every 3rd Wednesday of the month at 7pm. The next zoom meeting will be 17 January 2024.

8. **Spring Conference and Patriot's Pen, Voice of Democracy and Teacher of the Year Banquet** is 22 - 24 March 2024 at Indy Marriott East. Please make every effort to attend. Council of Administration Meeting is on Friday 22 March 2024 at 7pm. Business meeting starts at 9am on 23 March and Banquet will start at 6pm. Please see attached forms.

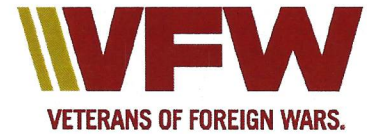



JANUARY 2024 MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

Greetings Comrades,

The State is at 87.95% Membership as of Dec 29th.

Congratulations goes out to District 11 for having the highest membership percentage as of Dec 29th, at 94.24%.

The following Districts will each receive (4) Banquet Tickets for the Spring Conference Banquet for being at 90+%: 4 - 91.48%, 8 - 90.66%, and 11 - 94.24%

The following Posts have achieved 102+ % in membership by Dec 29th: 1083 Crothersville (102.94%), 5626 Beech Grove (105.47%), 908 Indianapolis (108.13%), and 1587 Indianapolis (107.71%). Great job to each of these Posts! Each of them will be placed into a drawing for a \$300 cash prize.

Post 908 will receive \$150 and (2) Banquet Tickets for the Spring Conference Banquet for having the highest membership percentage being at 108.13%.

Posts 1083, 5626, and 1587 will each receive (2) Banquet Tickets for being over 102+%.

Note - Numbers will change by the time of publication.

Judy King received \$250 for recruiting 50 new/reinstated members. Danny K. Gann and Steve Milbourn will each receive a Commanders Certificate and gift for recruiting 10+ members.

Remember to read both the National and State Membership programs to see what is required, and how you and your members can contribute and earn recognition. 102% Membership across the board is not an illusion or something pulled out of thin air. ***It's coming directly from the National Commander in Chief.***

-Every single Post and each District must be recruiting at all times.

-Post and District leadership should be checking numbers weekly if not daily in MEMSTATS.

-Start cold calling your expired or soon to be expired lists. Winter is the best time to call them!

- Achieve **102%** in Membership. (*Post, District, and Department*)
- For everyone to **recruit at least one new member** and then mentor that member.
- Increase** membership drives and/or events.
- Develop new Posts and/or **revitalize existing Posts**.
- Increase Life Membership and Legacy Life Memberships**.

INCENTIVES

Early Dues Payment Incentives

(All Data Must be Confirmed in VFW National Memstats)

Continuous Member-Any Continuous member, new member or newly reinstated member who pays their dues by Dec 30, 2023, will have their name placed into a drawing for \$100. Unless their name is drawn, the names will remain eligible for the next drawing.

District Incentive-Any District that has every post recruit at least one new member by December 1, 2023, will receive \$1,000 to their district funds. If achieved after December 1, 2023, and before May 1, 2024, the District will receive \$750 to their district funds.

Legacy Life-Any member who becomes a Legacy Life member or advances a level (Bronze to Silver or Silver to Gold) will be placed in a drawing. If paying on installment plan, the plan must be completely paid to be eligible. If a Legacy Life member advance multiple levels they will have an entry for each level they advance. The drawing will be held at the 2024 State Convention.

- 1st name drawn - \$200
- 2nd name drawn- \$250

Life Member-Any member who joins as a Life member, converts to a Life member or a reinstate member who converts to Life member will be placed in a drawing. If paying of an installment plan the plan must be completely paid to be eligible. The drawing will be held at the 2024 State Convention.

- 1st name drawn - \$100
- 2nd name drawn- \$150

RECRUITER INCENTIVES

All members in good standing are eligible for Department Recruiter Awards. Recruited members must be ***Department of Indiana members***. Award deadline is June 1, 2024. Recruiters will receive their awards and be recognized at the State Convention.

- 10-New or reinstated members will receive a Commander's-Gift & certificate.
- 15-New or reinstated members will receive a Commanders Coin and \$75.00.
- 25-New or reinstated members will receive a Commander's-Gift and \$150.00.
- 50-New or reinstated members will receive \$250.00.
- 75-New or reinstated members will receive a \$350.00 stipend to the National Convention.
- 100-New or reinstated members will receive a \$500.00 stipend to the National Convention.

These awards are cumulative and will be presented at the very next Department meeting after the level is met. In summary, if you recruit 100 new or reinstated members for the Department of Indiana you will receive all the awards listed above, a cash total of \$1325.00. If you receive another stipend to the National convention, you will receive the recruiter award for \$75 and \$100 in CASH, but you must attend the National Convention to receive the cash award.

POST INCENTIVES

Highest Percentage in Membership

The Post having the highest percentage in membership on January 31, 2024, will receive \$100.00, two banquet tickets for the Spring Banquet and will be recognized at the Spring Conference.

DISTRICT INCENTIVES

DISTRICT COMMANDER AWARDS

The District Commander who attains 102% in membership on June 1, 2024, leads the State in Membership, had a School of Instruction by October 1, 2023, and had a new or reinstate in each post in their District will receive a \$200.00 award.

For a District Commander to be a Round Robin Commander, all posts must be 102% in membership by May 31, 2024. They will be recognized at the State Convention. If a

District Commander becomes Round Robbin after May 31st, 2024, they will be recognized at School of Instruction.

NEW AND REINSATE AWARDS

The leading Post Commander by Division whose Post has at least 10 new or reinstated members and has a total membership of 102% by June 1, 2024, will receive \$200.00.

The District Commander who attains 102% in membership on June 1, 2024, leads the State in Membership, had a School of Instruction by October 1, 2023, and had a new or reinstate in each post in their District will receive a \$200.00 award.

For a District Commander to be a Round Robin Commander, all posts must be 102% in membership by May 31, 2024. They will be recognized at the State Convention. If a District Commander becomes Round Robin after May 31st, 2024, they will be recognized at School of Instruction.

Happy new year, VFW! This month, Commander-in-Chief Duane Sarmiento is issuing a challenge to our Posts to bring in new members - but wait, there's more! Because this challenge isn't just for the Posts, Departments can benefit as well!



It's a new year, and we want to see New members joining the VFW! So for the month of January, the Post in each membership division that brings in the most New members (Annual and/or Life) will receive a \$500 award deposited into the Post account!

In addition, for every Post that leads their division, their Department will also receive a \$500 award. We want to see our Department leadership motivating everyone and helping our Posts recruit!

This challenge will count New members who join the Post between January 1 and January 31. As a reminder, a New member is a veteran who has never been a member of the VFW before - we all know eligible veterans who haven't yet made the decision to become a member of the VFW, now is the time to bring them on board and make them a part of the Veterans of Foreign Wars!

There is no better time than now to help grow our ranks and help us meet the Commander-in-Chief's goal of 102% membership by the end of the year!

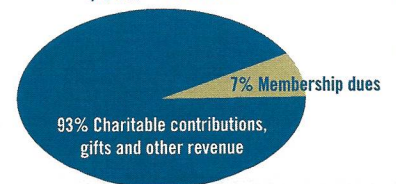
