TO BE READ AT MEETINGS AND POSTED:

- 1. Spring Conference and Mixer is 19 -21 March 2021 at Indy Marriott East. Cutoff date for Mixer Reservations is 12 March 2021. Council of Administration is on Friday 19 March 2021 at 1900 (uniform State Shirts and grey pants). Business session starts at 0900 on 20 March 2021 (uniform Blue Jacket, White Shirt, Grey Pants and Tie) and the Mixer at 1830 that evening. VFW National Representative will be Commander-In-Chief Hal Roesch. Please make every effort to attend. Please see attachment for Reservations forms.
- 2. Finance Meeting is 19 March 2021 at the State Headquarters at 1100.
- 3. VFW National Convention Registration Section 222 of the Manual of Procedure states each Post will pay, in advance, a national convention registration fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25) which shall entitle the Post to a packet of convention information and materials and one identified registered delegate for the VFW National Convention. Each additional delegate attending the national convention will pay a ten dollars (\$10) delegate fee provided the Post has paid the mandated \$25 advance registration fee. All advance registrations should be mailed to the VFW National Headquarters, 406 W. 34th Street, Kansas City, MO 64111, ATTN: Convention Registration or you may register online by going to vfw.org.
- 4. VFW National Convention Housing 122nd National Convention housing will officially open 19 March 2021. Housing reservation information will be located on the convention website accessed through the main VFW website at vfw.org/convention. The convention website will also have general convention information including the registration form and links to other convention related information for Baltimore, MD, 31 July 5 August 2021, including a tentative agenda.
- 5. Scout of the Year Posts are reminded that Scout of the Year scholarship program deadline is approaching. The post

should submit its winner up the organization so that all post winners are to the Department Chairman (Andy Whitt) not later than 1 April 2021. The Scout of the Year program information is available at www.vfw.org.

- 6. **All State:** The nomination for All State Post Commander and Quartermaster is included in these General Orders. The deadline for submission for All State nominations and related documentation is Noon on April 5, 2021. All material must be in hand at VFW State Headquarters at this time.
- 7. James Butters Award: The James Butters Award is an annual award that goes to a deserving Post Service Officer. The nomination form for this included within these documents. The deadline for submission is April 30, 2021. Submit nominations to the State Adjutant at VFW State Headquarters.
- 8. Post Elections: Attention is directed to Section 217 of the National By-Laws and the Manual of Procedure covering the nomination, election, and installation of Post Officers. Post-Election Report forms are being mailed to Post Quartermasters with instructions that they complete the form online through the Online Membership System (OMS) or they can complete the form and return directly to State Headquarters immediately following the election of Post Officers but not later than Friday, May 28, 2021.

A full slate of Post Officers is to be elected in April and installed in accordance with Section 217 of the Manual of Procedure. Installation of Post Officers must take place prior to the State Convention June 3 - 6, 2021, but they shall not assume their duties until the Department Commander is installed on 6 June 2021.

- 9. **District Meetings**: All District Commanders are reminded that if a District meeting is cancelled due to inclement weather or COVID-19 restrictions, they are to immediately notify the Department Representative, the State Adjutant, and their respective Posts Commanders.
- 10. All-American Dashboard: All Post and District Adjutants need to update the Dashboard.



The VFW Service Office has 3 Service Officer positions available. Resumes with a copy of DD-214 can be faxed, emailed, or mailed to the VFW State Headquarters (contact information below). The qualifications are:

- 1. Prior veteran-focused public service experience is strongly encouraged.
- 2. Medical experience/anatomy/training is strongly encouraged.
- 3. Must be a VFW member in good standing or join VFW prior to hire.
- 4. Must possess computer skills and have experience with Microsoft products.
- 5. Must be able to type 30 wpm or greater.
- 6. Must possess excellent people/communication skills.
- 7. Must possess excellent writing skills.
- 8. Willing to travel several times a year to National VFW and training events.
- 9. Willing to travel around the State on veteran outreach events.
- 10. Must possess excellent critical thinking and analytical skills.
- 11. Must pass a background check.
- 12. Must not have any history of felony convictions.
- 13. Must possess excellent ability to read, interpret, and apply the Code of Federal Regulations, and other regulatory laws and manuals published by VA, Federal and State Government.

Duties and responsibilities: All training will be provided by the VFW. Once accredited by the VA's Counsel, the Service Officer is responsible for accurately assisting all veterans, their survivors, and other valid claimants in maximizing their legal entitlements to all State and Federal veteran's benefits. This includes knowing, understanding, and providing detailed information on all said benefits. Where assistance is not available through the VFW, the Service Officer must maintain contact information on a myriad of State and Federal services, such as homelessness, financial aid, housing,

counseling, and many others, then refer clients to those services. The Service Officer is responsible for providing clients with accurate legal advice in the pursuit of VA Compensation and Pension benefits, to include prosecution with the Board of Veterans Appeals (BVA). Where legally possible, this includes interviewing the client, reviewing all available documentary evidence, then creating a valid legal argument in favor of the benefit, and assisting the client make said argument with the BVA. Where no legal argument in possible, the Service Officer will assist the client in presenting his/her information and testimony before the BVA.



The state has an Advisory level which refers to the current guidelines the county must follow. The county is color coded and the color indicates how many people you may have present for an event.

- Blue counties may have up to 250 individual present.
- Yellow counties may have up to 100 individual present.
- Orange counties up to 50 individuals present
- Red counties up to 25 individuals present.

Currently the state does not have any counties designated as Red and only 3 counties as Orange. This means the rest of the state is Blue or Yellow. Please go to the following link to see where your county stands in regards to COVID.



VFW Announces Annual Publications Contest

Submissions must be mailed by April 1

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (January 4, 2021) – The Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States is now accepting submissions for its 2020 National Publications Contest. VFW publications published up to four times annually, or five or more times annually, will be judged in four categories.

The categories are:

Department-level publications:

Newspaper/Newsletter

O Defined as being printed on newspaper stock.

Best Feature Story

O All publications judged together in this category and submitted separately. The story must be a published article of at least 300 words. It can be originally written by your newspaper/magazine staff or by a freelance writer, or be reprinted from a newspaper within your state. Feature articles published in online/electronic newsletters, newspapers or magazines also are eligible, but must be printed in color and submitted via USPS, not email.

Magazine

Defined by physical size and paper stock, or designed for online distribution as a PDF. Online/electronic magazines must be printed in color and submitted via USPS, not email.

District/Post-level publications:

o Overall Design and Content

Each category will be awarded three places: a grand award (first overall), silver (second overall) and bronze (third overall). Grand prize winners will receive a plaque, and the silver and bronze awards will take the form of a certificate suitable for framing.

The VFW Publication Department's awards system conforms to that of professional societies within the association publishing industry: National Mature Media Awards, Association Trends, Society of National Association Publications, Society of Professional Journalists and Communications Concepts. In other words, the same types of awards for which VFW magazine competes.

All entries submitted must have been published sometime between Jan. 1, 2020, and Dec. 31, 2020.

Examples of eligible subjects for the Best Feature submissions include operations of state VA departments, National Guard/Reserve unit deployments overseas, troop-support activities, Department VFW programs, dedication of state memorials and state or local commemorative events for the 50th anniversary of Vietnam. Editorials or opinion

articles WILL NOT be considered this year. Articles written by VFW magazine staff and reprinted in District, Post or Department publications will not be considered. Only one issue per publication will be reviewed by judges. DO NOT send multiple editions, as judges will not review all of them.

All entries should be sent directly to the VFW National Headquarters. Similar to last year, the competition will be open to any submission, not just the winning submissions from the Department level. This is to remove any bias at all levels. One copy of each submission should be postmarked by April 1, 2021, to:


