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“Just ask!”

As we start my year as your Veterans of Foreign Wars Department of Indiana Commander for 2022-2023, I want everyone to know I am available, “just ask”! If you are having an event for or about the VFW, celebrating a Post anniversary, having a Patriotic or a military based community event, ask the Adjutant to put it in my schedule, if possible, I will be there! If your Post needs help with a fund raiser and you think I can help, “just ask”! I am here to serve you, yes, I really mean that, I know a lot of people say it, but I plan on doing it. My goal is to visit every Post in Indiana, all 138, “just ask”!

With the assistance of Past Commanders and line officers we have developed an obtainable All State membership program for 2022-2023. There are some new requirements and some of the normal ones have been modified. The All State program for both Post and District is point based, a Post will need 2500 points out of the 3225 available, a District will need 2100 out of the 2725 available. There are new incentives for members to earn cash for recruiting or renewing early, and cash incentives for Post and Districts.

The VFW of Indiana is the 12th largest Department in the VFW, we could easily be in the top 10. Sometimes we act like we are a small little Department but we not, we are INDIANA. At last count Indiana has approximately 410,000 Veterans but the VFW Department of Indiana only has 26,947 members, and that number is going *down*. Yes, I realize many of those 410,000 Veterans are probably not eligible for our combat-based organization. According to information available in government databases there are around 300,000 combat veterans in Indiana, all potential members! I am not going to spend the entire year preaching on membership, but it is very important. Just ask the Commander In Chief when he testifies in front of Congress or ask our State Legislative Chairperson, the more members the more influence we have with politicians. The more influence the more earned benefits we can get for Veterans.

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I am however going to push hard on Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen. I think these programs are very important not just for the students but for the image of the VFW. If we get more students involved, we can show we are not just a smokey bar where grouchy old guys sit around and drink. The parents of those students are young, and many are Veterans, if they see we are more focused on the community, maybe they will want to be part of this great organization. To that end the Veteran Foundation of Indiana and the Council of Administration have agreed to increase the awards, see the letters in this manual from the Chairpersons.

I have been the Chairman of four Post suspensions committees and two of the Posts had to be closed. There is nothing in the VFW sadder than closing a Post that has been around for 50 years or more years. But that's what happens when no one will step-up or someone is allowed to mis-manage the Post funds, or both. As Commander of *YOUR POST*, you should know when your Post is headed in the wrong direction, don't wait till it's too late, ask for help early! Start with your District Commander they will help, or they will ask for help. The Department has many very experienced leaders who have seen a little bit of everything happen in a VFW Post, they can be a great resource and I am certain any of them will help, "just ask"!

Thank you for electing me Commander it will be my honor to serve the Veterans of Foreign Wars of Indiana. Let's all have a fun year and hopefully a very successful year for the VFW Department of Indiana. Do good things for the Veterans in our State and support our communities.

There is no way this one manual is going to answer all your questions. Remember your military training, use your chain of Command. Post to District, District to State and finally State to National. If there is a break down along the way by all means call me but the first thing, I will probably ask is did you follow the chain?

This is the first year for Indiana creating a Commanders Manual. My goal is prove the value of a document like this in hopes to continue it each year and make the manual a real asset to Post and District Commanders. Duties & Responsibilities of a Post Commander

The duties and responsibilities of a Post Commander are extensive, and the list below is by no means complete. This is an attempt to provide Post Commanders a resource and a basic guide. Without a doubt being a Post Commander is the hardest job in the VFW. Your best resource is previous Commanders, your District Commander, the latest version of the Congressional Charter, Bylaws, Manual of Procedure and Ritual, if you don't have one get one, it is available online at VFW.ORG or the VFW Store.

1. Familiarize yourself with:

- a. VFW Congressional Charter, Bylaws, Manual of Procedure and Ritual
- b. Department Bylaws
- c. Department Club Rules
- d. Post Bylaws
- e. Post Club/House Rules (If applicable)
- f. Post SOP or other written policies (If applicable)

2. Holding monthly Post meeting:

- a. Familiarize yourself with
 - i. Robert's Rules of Order
 - ii. Know how to handle motions and basic parliamentary procedure
- b. Know when to use the gavel ad when to salute. One rap calls attention or seats the body when standing. Two raps of the gavel calls everyone to standing attention.
- c. Prepare a written guide or use the VFW Ritual to run a proper meeting.
- d. **At the start of each meeting have the members recite the purpose of the VFW, Section 230102-Purposes of the Congressional Charter (see ritual).**
- e. Ensure accurate minutes are taken.
- f. Properly initiate any new members.
- g. Ensure General Orders are reviewed.
- h. Only official VFW covers are allowed no ball caps.

3. You are responsible for the Post participating in the following Programs:

- a. Voice of Democracy
- b. Patriot's Pen
- c. Teacher of the Year
- d. Scout of the Year
- e. Buddy Poppy

4. Membership - Everyone's Responsibility

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- a. Understand the State Membership Plan, every Post can make All State and everyone should try for All American.
- b. Know your membership resources:
 - i. Department Membership Chairperson and regional membership chairpersons, they are in the directory.
- c. Appoint a member to be your Post membership chairperson, usually SVC or JVC.
- d. Understand the National Membership Plan

5. Membership – New and Transfers

- a. Ensure each new member application or transfer is reviewed by the membership investigation committee for eligibility. This should include both new candidates and transfers.
- b. Your membership must vote on any new or transferred member. The membership may accept or deny any new candidate or transferring member.
- c. Each new member must be initiated, see Initiation ceremony in the ritual.

6. You are responsible for the Post Inspection being completed.

- a. Not the Quartermaster – You are responsible.
- b. Ensure the Quartermaster and the Adjutant have the documentation called for on the Inspection form.
- c. Prepare in advance for the Inspection.
- d. Remember Inspections are not a PASS/FAIL – they are merely a program to ensure your Post is on the right track.

7. Post Officers

- a. Ensure all officers of the Post understand their responsibilities. (See VFW Congressional Charter, Bylaws, Manual of Procedure and Ritual).
- b. Work with the junior officers, develop your team, someday you want them to become Commander.
- c. Have them attend School of Instruction at the District and State level.

8. If you have a canteen/club room.

- a. Ensure your House Committee understands their responsibilities.
- b. Ensure they are familiar with the Department Club Rules.
- c. You and the Quartermaster are members of the House Committee.
- d. You are not the manager of the canteen/club room, the House Committee is tasked with managing the canteen/club room.

9. District & Department functions:

- a. Post Commander or your representative must attend District meetings. If your Post misses two in a row the Post Commander will be suspended.
- b. You should attend the District and Department School of Instruction.

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- c. Your Post should be represented at all District and Department functions, including:
 - i. Fall Conference and Spring Conference (See Department Calendar)
 - ii. State Convention (See Department Calendar)
 - iii. State visit to the National Home (See Department Calendar)
 - iv. State visit to the Indiana Veterans Home (See Department Calendar)

10. Miscellaneous:

- a. Election Report – make sure it is correct, including emails and phone numbers for each position. IF someone resigns or is no longer filling the position then you need to correct the election report.
- b. Ensure the Quartermaster is properly bonded.
- c. Ensure the Quarterly Trustee Audit is completed by the Trustees not the Quartermaster.
- d. Ensure all fees to the District and Department are paid when due.
- e. Ensure delegates are elected to the Department Convention and the National Convention.
- f. There are many awards available to deserving members, review the Department Awards section of the Commanders Manual.

The Post is your responsibility, take care of it.

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Department, District & Post Surgeons Duties & responsibilities

To start I would like to say how honored I am to have been chosen to be your Department of Indiana Surgeon. It is now my job to live up to the trust you have given me.

Department

The office of Surgeon shall be an elected office as prescribed in the Department bylaws.

The Department Surgeon shall by direction of the Department Commander or Council of Administration conduct inspections of Department of Veterans Affairs medical centers and state Veterans homes and shall prepare reports on such inspections which will be forwarded to the Department Commander. The Surgeon shall assist District and Post Surgeons in an advisory capacity and promote statewide health programs. They shall perform such other duties as are incident to their office and as directed by the Department.

Being that the Surgeon as prescribed in the Department Bylaws is in the order of succession they should familiarize themselves with the duties and responsibilities of the Jr. Vice, Sr. Vice and Commander.

District

The District Surgeon shall be an elected office as prescribed in the Bylaws and Manual for procedures article IV Sec.417 Nomination, Election, Installation and term of office.

The District Surgeon shall perform the duties properly pertinent to their office. The Surgeon shall assist with the school of instruction for the post Surgeons. The Surgeon shall perform such

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other duties as may from time to time be required by the laws and usages of this organization or lawful orders from proper authority.

During your visits to the post in your district meet with the Post Surgeon and address any concerns they may have.

Post

The Post Surgeon may be elected or the post Commander may appoint the Surgeon if required by the Post Bylaws as prescribed in the Bylaws and Manual of Procedures Article 2 sec.216 Elected and Appointed Officers; Chairman and Committees.

The Post Surgeon shall perform such duties as are incident to the office or as may from time to time be required of the Surgeon by the laws and usages of the organization or lawful orders from proper authority.

As your Post Surgeon you are charged with the health and safety of your membership and the public you may come in contact with. Work closely with the Chaplain, House Committee and managers of your Post to address any health or safety matters. Along with a committee plan and organize health and safety programs. Promptly address any hazards throughout your Post and its grounds. Perform frequent inspections and report your findings to the Post Commander.

Ensure Post Trustee reports are accurate for the Quarterly Report of Audit.

Reconcile and verify all transactions listed on all bank statements to assure the accuracy of State records.

Comply with, and perform all duties required by the laws and usages of this organization, applicable Bylaws and orders from lawful authority and perform such other duties as are incident to such office.

Report on transactions concerning receipts and expenditures, for any given period, at a regular or special meeting of the Post.

File appropriate forms as required by Federal, State and Local Statutes or regulations.



The All State Post Packet must include the entry form, along with any other supporting documentation should be emailed to the Department Adjutant, adj@vfw.org. It can be sent by US Mail (must be mailed early to meet the deadline) or personally delivered to VFW Department Headquarters. - Community Service – Must complete monthly Community Service Reports as required by the Department Community Service Chairperson

It can be sent by US Mail (must be mailed early to meet the deadline) or personally delivered to VFW Department Headquarters. To ensure your awards are available at the Department Convention the packet must meet the deadlines noted above. The Commander and a committee of Past Commanders will review all entries.

All Service Officers employed by the VFW of Indiana are members of the VFW. All Service Officers and Claims Consultants have completed all VA and VFW required training and are accredited by the VA through the VFW and perform their duties in accordance with the National Policy and Procedure Manual of the VFW National Veterans Service (NVS).

The mission of the Department Service Office is simple and to the point:

MISSION STATEMENT: Assist and advise all veterans, regardless of affiliation, with filing for their Veterans Benefits that they are entitled. Serve as an Advocate for the VFW, the VA and the Indiana Department of Veterans Affairs supporting our community and Indiana Hoosiers.

From these sources claims for benefits are received, prepared, and submitted to the VA.

The Department Service Office is under the direction of the Department Service Officer, Shawn Ransford (LTC, US Army Retired), an Iraq veteran. Currently, the Service Office staff includes one Assistant Department Service Officer. The Regional Office staff currently includes one

Commanders must report on-line or on the Community Activities Report Form by March 15th in order to qualify for a National Certificate of Recognition. Each Post must report in each of the following categories to qualify:

- A. Community Involvement
- B. Cooperation with other Organizations
- C. Aid to Others
- D. School and Church assistance

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Community activities clearly benefits the people within the local community and involves the Post members to build a positive image for the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

When taking on a project, inform your local newspaper or TV station about your plans and if possible, document your efforts by taking photos as you work on your Community Activities, posting and sharing on your Posts social media.

Membership and community involvement will increase your Post and our goal. We must continue to work within our communities because “No One Does More For Veterans”.

Please feel free to reach out to me if you have any questions.

Remember to report your dollars spent, total hours, and total number of volunteers for each project. Please make sure the dollars reported reflect only those amounts donated or expended in the performance of their community activities.

Our goal is to be 90% reported by December 31st.

3. Post By-Laws are up to date, i.e. updated within the last 10 years.
4. 990 is properly filed with the state.
5. Officers are eligible to hold office.

"Your main goal is to make sure your Posts are in good working order!"

For the larger districts I would recommend an inspection team (2 or 3) of past commanders or someone that you trust to fill out the forms correctly and care about your posts and the VFW.

While I do not anticipate any changes from National to the form be aware a directive may be coming to focus on a particular area.

SMART/MAHER VFW NATIONAL CITIZENSHIP EDUCATION TEACHER AWARD CITATIONS FOR ELEMENTARY, MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL TEACHERS AND THEIR SCHOOLS

Each year, the Veterans of Foreign Wars selects elementary, middle and high school teachers to participate in the Smart/Maher VFW National Citizenship Education Teacher program. Effective this year, VFW Post Teacher Award Chairman may submit one candidate in each grade level, to their District by November 15, if applicable, or to their Department Headquarters by January 1. The Department will select a single candidate and submit them to VFW National Headquarters by February 1 for national judging. VFW's Department Teacher winners that are received at National Headquarters will receive a VFW National citation for both the winning teacher and their school.

Who Is Eligible?

1. Teachers who promote civic responsibility, flag etiquette and patriotism are prime candidates for this award. For example, do you know a teacher who plans field trips to city hall or organizes community volunteer projects? Maybe you know an instructor who invites veterans into the classroom to discuss their military experiences. Perhaps you are familiar with a teacher who fosters the development of democratic values and beliefs through special projects. If you know of such a teacher, honor him or her today.
2. All current certified/licensed teachers in grades K-12 are eligible. Previous national winners are ineligible. Nominations can be submitted by themselves, fellow teachers, supervisors, family members or other interested individuals.

Documentation Required for all Candidates:

1. All Post-level nominees should provide a one-page resume as a minimum or up to five pages as a maximum of documentation of their teaching experience (for example: references, news articles, etc.) and a head-and-shoulder photo of themselves, if available.

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These items will be forwarded on to the Department with the winning teacher entry form.

How are teachers nominated?

Fill out the nomination form contained in this brochure, and provide a one-page resume as a minimum or up to five pages as a maximum of documentation of their teaching experience (for example: references, news articles, etc.) and a head-and-shoulder photo if available. Please submit your completed nomination form signed, along with the required documentation to your local VFW Post.

What Is the Deadline for My Entry?

All entries competing at the Post level must be in the hands of that VFW Post by midnight, Oct. 31, 2022. It is the responsibility of the nominator to meet this deadline by submitting their entry to the proper location by ensuring it is a participating Post.

What Are the Judging Criteria?

Citizenship (1-25 points): On a scale of 1-25, to what extent does the teacher encourage and/or model good citizenship and community involvement?

Innovation (1-25 points): On a scale of 1-25, how much innovation (new ideas, new tools, new resources, and new approaches) does this teacher utilize in the classroom? Does this teacher's effort reflect an ongoing desire to stimulate the students with new things?

Resources (1-25 points): On a scale of 1-25, to what degree has this teacher demonstrated an ability to identify and utilize new and exceptional resources to fund, facilitate and provide materials for his or her classroom? Does this teacher tap into outside agencies, organizations and individuals to acquire materials and expertise in the classroom? As an example – bringing speakers, finding in-kind and monetary donations, or utilizing local opportunities like museums, field trips and local events.

Passion (1-25 points): On a scale of 1-25, to what degree does this teacher appear to be passionate about the profession of teaching? Are they regularly seeking to upgrade their skills? Do they try and find ways to encourage their students? Do they take a personal interest in their student's individual success?

The 2022-2023 Theme is “Why is the Veteran Important?”

Program Overview

The Voice of Democracy Scholarship Competition is especially designed for high school students from grades 9 through 12 including home school students. It is a valuable educational experience for students and a wonderful opportunity for positive publicity for students, teachers, schools, and for the VFW in your community. The program dates back to 1946 and continues to be one of the VFW's most exciting programs. The VFW annually commits \$3 million in scholarships and incentives at the Post, District, State and National levels. Participants write and then record a three to five minute audio-essay on a patriotic theme selected annually. The Voice of Democracy Program is endorsed by the National Association of Secondary School Principals and is designed to foster patriotism in the participants and to enhance their written and oral communication skills. In addition, this program demonstrates the VFW's willingness to partner with local schools and the community.

Key Information for Posts

You may make this a joint effort with your Post Auxiliary. Prior planning insures a high level performance. Start early! In August, send press releases to local newspapers announcing the 2022-2023 topic. Shortly after school starts, bring or send Voice of Democracy materials to local principals or a previously developed contact within the school. Remember that there are many home schooled students that cannot be reached through the local schools, this makes media presence even more critical to the success of this program. Furthermore, please remember that entries need not come from schools (even if the student entering is NOT homeschooled). No Post “owns” any school for the purpose

of Voice of Democracy entries, however, District Chairpersons should work with their Posts to ensure efforts are not duplicated, resources are not wasted and “turf wars” don’t start.

Make sure you have a core group of judges identified, selected and groomed well in advance of the Post judging. Always check your equipment before the judging begins to insure it functions properly.

Once the Post judging is completed, Chairpersons and Commanders should ensure that the winner’s materials are properly submitted to the District Voice of Democracy Chairperson. Please follow the District Chairperson’s instructions regarding where, when and how entries are to be submitted. Unless otherwise directed, you will need to submit items 1-4, that are listed below under Key information for Districts. Do not forget to heap loads of recognition and praise on your Post Winner(s).

Completing press release for the local paper with a picture, as well as some prize for the winner(s) would be most appropriate.

Posts may advance their “winner(s)” based on the following schedule. Please follow any additional guidance that the District Chairperson may provide.

1-15 essays – One (1) entry to District 16-30 essays – Two (2) entries

31-45 essays – Three (3) entries (NOTE: Each additional 15 essays entitles another entry. The number of schools participating does not affect the number of entries allowed)

Post participation is to be entered in the OMS Dashboard by the Post Adjutant NLT November 20th, 2022 so that the Post will get credit for participating in the Voice of Democracy Program. NOTE: If your Post Adjutant doesn’t record your participation, your Post will not will not get credit for this core program.

Key Information for Districts

District Chairpersons are urged to aggressively promote the Voice of Democracy Program. After coordination with your Auxiliary counterpart please reach out to every Post and Auxiliary in your District. Establish a quick, easy and effective line of communication between you and the Post Voice of Democracy Chairman/ Commander. Consider using e-mail or social media for this purpose. As the District meeting is to be a School of Instruction, it would not be at all out of line for the Voice of Democracy Chairman to ask for time to train Post Voice of Democracy Chairmen and Commanders on the program requirements.

Districts may advance one winner to the State Competition. Be sure to forward your District Winner’s entry material to the State VOD Chairperson to arrive no later than December 15th, 2022. The winner’s package must include the following:

1. Recorded Speech (on Flash Drive or other electronic device (no CD)
2. Typed copy of the speech

3. Entry form with all necessary signatures
4. A glossy head and shoulder color photograph(s) of your winner are acceptable but a good quality digital photo is much preferred. Photos taken by a smart phone are acceptable and can be easily emailed.

(A flash drive with all information is also perfectly acceptable. If that is foreign to you please recruit someone to help you.)

Prize Structure at the National and State Level

There will be a lunch downtown (probably

Patriot's Pen Essay Contest Patriot's Pen gives 6th, 7th and 8th grade students the opportunity to express their opinion on a patriotic theme and improve their writing skills, while they compete for awards and prizes. Cumulatively, the awards provided from all levels of the competition total \$1.2 million each year.

To ensure a successful competition, Posts and Auxiliaries must commit knowledgeable chairmen, enthusiastic volunteers and resources to both competitions. Our goal is to increase the number of participating students every year. Approach schools in the spring because that is when most curriculum decisions are made for the coming Fall. In late summer, revisit to ensure they have the necessary materials and are prepared to do the program. Don't hesitate to involve school administrators, PTA/PTO/PSO parents, teachers, counselors, radio and TV stations, newspapers, churches and other service, civic and community groups/organizations to encourage and facilitate student participation, help with the judging and generally promote the programs. We provide score sheets, brochures, sample news releases and PSAs on vfw.org – you would log in at vfw.org as a VFW member, then click on My VFW and look for the VFW Training and Support section under the Member Resources column. Then click on Citizenship Education, Youth Scholarships and Activities. Present VFW Scholarship Programs anywhere there are groups of students who might be interested. In addition to schools and home school programs; chairman should consider church youth groups, athletic teams, and Boy Scout and Girl Scout units – any place where young people can be reached.

While it is not required at the post level, I do ask that District Patriot Pen Coordinators collect a head shot portrait to include with their winning submission. This is required for the state entry into the national contest. Please also ensure that all applications submitted to both the district and state have completed applications including all necessary signatures. Incomplete applications will not be judged.

History of the "Buddy" Poppy

Inspired by the poem "In Flanders Fields" by Canadian Colonial John McCrae. The V.F.W conducted their first Poppy campaign just prior to Memorial day 1922. Those Poppies were made in France. Today disabled, needy and aging Veterans in V.A hospitals, state Veterans homes and domiciliaries from every corner of our country assemble Poppies for shipment across the country. V.F.W pays the disabled Veteran for their work. This helps with their mental and physical therapy as well as helping pay for the little luxuries of life.

The program

Remember that every day can be a Poppy day. Always have Poppies available in your post home. In my experience the public associates the "Buddy" Poppy with the V.F.W. For that reason any time your post is out in the community have Poppies on hand. Memorial day will always be associated with the Buddy Poppy but the Poppy is a year-around program. The post DISTRIBUTES Poppies and will accept contributions. We do not sell Poppies. People do not have to contribute for you to offer them one.

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Always give the children a Poppy. They get such a kick out of it. Remember that we are part of the community. Always dress appropriate. Wear your cover. Give the public a positive view of our organization. The proceeds are for Veterans welfare, their needy dependents and the orphans of Veterans. A portion of the funds goes to our National Home in Eaton Rapids Michigan.

Make A Plan

Post Chairman should assemble a Committee of enthusiastic fellow members. This committee can help plan events, procure locations and recruit volunteers. Remember that anytime Poppies are being distributed a V.F.W member must be present. Post a sign-up sheet for volunteers. Make sure you recognize those who participate. The V.F.W store offers supplies, certificates and awards. Each post is required to purchase 5 Poppies for every member of the post. The "Buddy" Poppy order form can be found on the Department website @ vfw.org/resources/reports & forms. The order form is under the post forms. Also check the General Orders. The order form will be in them several times a year.

Youth Activities is more than just Scouting and encompasses a group of programs that today's Youth can involve themselves in. To name a few the VFW recognizes is of course Scouting in all its forms, Junior Reserve Officer Training Courses, and Civil Air Patrol. Also included are Hunting and Shooting Programs underwritten by the National Rifle Association. As the Post Chairman you should download the Youth Activities Chairman's Manuel from the VFW Web Site and review its contents. It is a short document and it can be reviewed in just a few minutes. Now let's talk about the Scouting Awards Program for just a minute.

1. Application may be downloaded from the State Web Site along with a Judging Score Card should a post have more than one application.
2. The Application must be complete to include all signatures - If you miss on I'll call you and get your "OK" to sign your name - the Post Commander Signature is the one most often forgotten.
3. A word on the Scouts Photo - a. Full Uniform reflecting the Eagle, Gold, or Quartermaster Award; b. Should no more than waist up. c. should have the troop flag (if the troop has one) and the Stars and Stripes in the background. d. while the application states 3X5 a 4X6 is more common today and is acceptable.
4. The required documents - a. single page - 1 sided resume of the candidates school activities that include all the listed requirements, b. a scouting record reflecting the scouts activities from beginning to end and be sure it identifies all leadership roles to include the scouts project, c. a single page of the scouts community service activities and accomplishments and recognitions.
5. Finally and probably the most important and overlooked requirement, The Letters of Recommendation. These are the most important pieces to the puzzle and the most often poorly presented as they fail to hit the bulls eye. What do I mean? Well some examples are in order to help you understand I Think. 3 required letters include a. a Scout Leader, b. a community member, and c. a teacher or faculty member. Each letter must reflect how the Scout demonstrated exemplary leadership in a. scouting, b. community, and c. school. The key here is that the letter must tell the reader how the scout demonstrated exemplary leadership

specific to each situation such as scouting. "A good scout and builds all the camp fires when we campout," does not quite cut the mustard. Two additional letters may be submitted and must meet the same requirements for demonstrating exemplary leadership. I would recommend a letter from Church Pastor etc., and someone from another youth organization.

I recommend that each Post forwarding a Scout of the Year recognize the Scout at Post level. Note there is no first, second, and third place in this program. Certificates are available from the VFW Store.

Now let me switch gears and address the JROTC and CAP programs. Each year JROTC awards its Cadets various ribbons etc., and within the VFW Program there are medals and certificates to support the top performers. If you receive a request for support, providing the medals and certificates, you should make every effort to obtain and present them to the recipients.

I grew up in Logansport, Indiana and currently reside there. I am married to Tamara. I have 2 children, 1 stepchild and 2 grandchildren.



The origins of today's VFW National Home can be traced to a 23-year-old woman named Amy Ross. In 1922, Ross made it her mission to help find jobs for the thousands of unemployed veterans in Detroit.

THE BEGINNING

News of Ross' efforts reached millionaire cattleman Corey Spencer, who gifted 472 acres of land near Eaton Rapids, Michigan, to build on Ross' vision of supporting veterans.

On Jan. 7, 1925, the VFW National Home was founded, helping to fulfill the VFW pledge to "honor the dead by helping the living." Later that spring, the Home welcomed its first family in an old frame farmhouse, Mrs. Pollett and her six children. Pollett had become suddenly widowed and lost her husband's military pension.

THROUGH THE YEARS

Since its founding, the VFW National Home has grown from an old frame farmhouse to a sprawling campus with playgrounds; park areas; and multiple buildings, including single-family homes, a community center and gymnasium, child care facility, guest lodge, chapel, and administrative offices.

Over the years, the National Home has evolved to meet the changing needs of America's military and veterans' families. Through it all, one thing has remained constant: the National

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Home's commitment to honor our nation's veterans and active-duty military by providing help and hope for their children and families.

Veterans and Military Support Programs

The Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) being at the forefront of patriotism the members and the organization are continually finding ways to foster support of United States veterans and current members of the armed forces. The VFW Veterans and Military Support Programs are designed to give support to veterans, service members and their families. The cornerstone of this program is the involvement of local Posts with the military family and their units.

ADOPT-A-UNIT: The Adopt-A-Unit program was developed to pledge VFW Post and Auxiliary support to the service members and families of a unit from the local military community. When a Post “adopts” a unit, they make a commitment to the service members and their families through moral and emotional support before, during and after deployment. To Adopt-A-Unit, fill out the Application for Sponsorship and submit it to VFW National Headquarters. A Certificate of Adoption will be mailed to the Post in approximately four weeks. An annual report is required.

MAP GRANTS: The MAP Grant program is intended as financial assistance for Posts, Districts, and Departments to sponsor events for military units of the Active-Duty, National Guard, and Reserves. These events are most successful when local Posts interact directly with the military unit, involving National Certified Recruiters and Veterans Service Officers. A MAP Grant Application should be submitted to VFW National Headquarters a minimum of three weeks prior to the event. The application must be filled out completely, and include a signature by the Commander or Quartermaster, an itemized event budget,

description of VFW involvement with the event, Federal Tax ID number, and IRS tax-exempt status.

UNMET NEEDS: We understand the challenges veterans, service members and military families can face and believe that experiencing financial difficulties should not be one of them. That's the premise behind the VFW's **Unmet Needs** program.

Unmet Needs is there to help America's military families who have run into unexpected financial difficulties as a result of deployment or other military-related activity or injury. The program provides financial aid grants of up to \$1,500 to assist with basic life needs in the form of a grant - not a loan - so no repayment is required. To further ease the burden, we pay the creditor directly.

The needs of our veterans, service members and their families should never go unmet. Let us offer you a hand up when you need it!

The VFW's "Sport Clips Help A Hero Scholarship" provides service members and veterans with the financial assistance they need to complete their educational goals without incurring excessive student loan debt. It's just another way for us to say "thank you" to those who fought for our freedoms.

Scholarship Details:

- Scholarships of up to \$5,000 will be awarded to qualified applicants.
- Awarded scholarships are limited to one per family per semester.
- Applications for the fall semester will be accepted Jan. 1 through April 30.
- Applications for the spring semester will be accepted Aug. 1 through Nov. 15.
- Fall semester scholarships will be awarded in August, and spring semester scholarships will be awarded in January.
- Scholarships must be used by the end of the school semester for which the veteran is applying, or they will become null and void.
- Scholarships are restricted for tuition and fees only and will be paid directly to accredited schools.

Eligible Applicants Must:

- Be a citizen of the United States.
- Be retired, honorably discharged, active duty, or a member of the National Guard or Reserve.
- Have completed Basic Training and follow-on training (Advanced Individual Training, technical school, etc.).
- Separated with or currently hold a military rank of E-5 or below.
- Demonstrate a need for financial assistance.
- Participate in, be accepted to or currently enrolled in a VA-approved program or school at an accredited post-secondary institution.

As the Chairman of this committee, I want to encourage every post that is near to a unit to reach out to them and adopt them. Greencastle post 1550 has already adopted its local armory. I feel that this is not only a way to foster a relationship with your local

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units; but it will hopefully encourage growth in your post and community. I also encourage anyone that has students that meet the criteria for the Help a Hero Scholarship reach out and apply for it.



VFW RIDERS

To start a VFW Riders group within your VFW Post you first will need to get the approval of the Post and its Comrades. Then you will need a minimal of 5 Comrades to begin, some will call this the Original Five . Once you have the 5 Comrades you will need to put in for your charter. Once that has happened you will then fill the paperwork out and submit it to State so they can then request a Charter from Nationals on behalf of your Post. Once they get the charter back from Nationals and you are approved you will then need to have a meeting to vote in your officers, the President, Vice President, Quartermaster (which is the Post QM unless they choose to designate someone from the group that is in good standing with the Post), Road Captain, Chaplain, and Sgt. At Arms. At this point you will need to write your Bylaws for your VFW RIDERS GROUP. These bylaws are what is best for your group and how you want or who you want to hold offices rather it be the Comrades or Auxiliary or a combination of both. The guidelines are on the VFW national site and is just that, guidelines.

You can reach out to the State Riders Chairman and also to your other Riders Post to see how they have theirs which will assist you on writing yours. Not all VFW Riders Groups have the same bylaws because each Post is different and what works for one does not always work for others. There is also discussion on "support" riders. Again this is how you as a VFW Riders group will decide and write your Bylaws.

If you have any questions please do not hesitate to reach out to the State VFW Riders Chairman James Davis or you can reach out to me Russell "Gabby" Pryor VFW Riders Group Post 261, Dave Hammons is the past State Chairman VFW Riders Group Post 908. We all would be happy to answer or assist in anyway possible. Please reach out and let us help.

Remember we are a Veterans Riders Group that is a representative of the VFW, the State of Indiana, our District and our Posts. We are to always act in accordance. We are here to support our Veterans, Auxiliary and our Community and as we ride we need to remember this. This is

Since 1923, our first year as a part of the VFW, the Cooties have worked hard to further the aims of the VFW while adding to it the frivolity known as Military Humor to the serious work of our parent organization. What would ultimately become known as the VFW National Home for Children, a sprawling campus of homes located in Eaton Rapids, Michigan, started out as the brainchild of the MOC.
