1 September 2022 2022-2023 Series

TO BE READ AT MEETINGS AND POSTED

- 1. Post Quartermaster Bond from the Department through National expired 31 August 2022. If you have not already renewed, the application for bond renewal is attached to these General Orders. Also attached is information on bonds for canteen personnel. All Bond requests must have application along with payment.
- 2. Attention of all members is directed to the purposes listed with the VFW"s Congressional Chart. "To maintain and extend the institutions of American freedom" is one the VFW's chartered purposes; as such the VFW represents fighting for American rights, civil rights and humanitarian impulses that have always guided the VFW's principles.

Today the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States reaffirms its commitment to that chartered purpose by first recognizing that in order to end racism within our organization it is not enough to be non-racist/non-discriminatory: we must be proactive. While we focus on education and mentorship we work to identify, address, and eradicate any and all forms of racial bias and discrimination. We will work to eliminate racial injustices and discriminatory practices within our organization. The VFW's leadership is united in the pursuit to end racial bias and discrimination while empowering our members and the greater veteran community towards this collective goal.

3. Attention of all members is directed to Section 901 of the National Bylaws, "Discipline of Members." Members who have committed offenses recognized by the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States may be subject to disciplinary action. Members are reminded that acts of Sexual Harassment, Racial or Sexual Discrimination, and all other conduct prejudicial to good order and discipline or conduct determined to be unbecoming of a member will not be condoned. In general, harassment and discrimination consist of any form of verbal, non-verbal, or physical conduct that is sufficiently severe and/or pervasive enough to have the purpose or effect of creating an

intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment or otherwise interfering with another's ability to participate in VFW events. All members will be treated with dignity and respect.

- 4. For purposes of clarification, we do not operate as a men's organization or a ladies organization, but as the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States and its VFW Auxiliary.
- 5. **Every Post** chartered by the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States will be expected to participate in the following programs during the 2022-23 year: Voice of Democracy, Patriots Pen, Buddy Poppy and Veterans and Military Support Programs. Additionally, it is necessary that all Post and Department Commanders comply with all provisions of the National Bylaws and the Manual of Procedure and Ritual.
- 6. No Post or District events should conflict with Department events.

Alcoholic beverages shall not be served or consumed in the Post or Auxiliary meeting room during a meeting", this must be enforced!

That is the fact there was not any Post to submit an offer to host next years Golf Tournament. Comrades,

The National Convention in Kansas City was back to its normal full-blown celebration of the VFW and the Auxiliary. Without a doubt our hospitality suite was absolutely the best one I visited; an opinion shared by many. Our hospitality team Dave Fradenburg and Cheryl Brown worked their butts off making it the best. A very heart felt thank you to both, all the volunteers who pitched in and to our partners from Michigan. Hopefully all who attend the Convention learned something to make their Post, District or Department better in the coming year.

The Post in Vincennes had a very "hot" golf outing. It's a wonder they could even have one after all the rain in the week prior to and even the day before. But all in all, the golf was good, considering I was probably one of the worst golfers out there. The Post had great food and some excellent entertainment in the evening for everyone. Some of the golfers on Sunday morning may have enjoyed the Post a little bit too much.

Some brief updates:

The VFW Service Office now has an office in the Indiana Veterans Center at Building 777 on North Meridian. This office is manned two days a week allowing Veterans to apply for VA benefits without the hassle of the Federal Building. Plans are to have a Service Officer in Roudebush Veterans' Administration Medical Center as soon as we can work out the details. The Department Council of Administration has approved our new Standard Operating Procedures. The newly approved SOP will hopefully make operation of the Department more consistent.

The line officers and many of the Committee Chairperson's developed Indiana's the first ever Commanders Manual. The manual provides a comprehensive guide for Post Commanders, including the 2022-2023 All-State Membership Program and the updated Department Awards program. The manual was given to all Post and District Commanders and is available at www.vfwin.org under the Resources tab.

The School of Instruction was extremely well attended, most attendees being first timers. Jerry Blake the Dean of the School did an outstanding job preparing the agenda and the instructors for a day of learning more about VFW programs. All the Instructors where well prepared and presented up to date information in a very professional manner. The HQ staff worked hard getting everything in place and the lunch was worth standing in line for. Thank you to everyone involved – I think it was a very successful School of Instruction. Terri and I had the unique opportunity this past week to delivered supplies to the flood victims of Eastern Kentucky on behalf of the Department of Indiana Veterans of Foreign Wars. On Monday evening myself, Greg Osborne and Mike Seeman went to a warehouse in downtown Indy operated by the Veterans Support Council of Indianapolis. Don Hawkins donated the supplies, then him and his crew helped us load my trailer and completely fill



my pickup truck including the backseat. We loaded everything from water and meals ready to eat, baby food, blankets and hair brushes, just to name some of the items. Tuesday morning at 0630 hours Terri and I headed for VFW Post 7387 in Hazard, Kentucky. We arrived at the Post right after lunch and started unloading with the help of local volunteers.

The closer we got to Hazard the worse it got; the damage was just unbelievable. In this part of Kentucky, it is very mountainous. On one side of the road are mountains and the other is a river, typically the riverbed is 25-30 feet below the road. In several places the flood waters had washed over the road, sadly marked by a large collection of debris. Everything from cars to large parts of houses and many unrecognizable items. In many places you could tell where a house once stood but nothing remains now except a foundation! In and around the rivers beds you could see all types of flood debris – cars and trucks, chunks of houses, appliances, clothes, kid's toys, a trailer house, parts of everything. Some of the debris well over 25 – 30 feet up in the trees.

Local volunteers at the Post told us what we saw was nothing compared to the back country. At county crossroads were once stood a few houses, normally a convenience store and maybe a church. There is nothing now, nothing at all. In some places you can't even fine the foundations, they are buried in the mud! We heard stories of triumphs, like a young man saving one woman's life and kidding he got to second base with her while rescuing her, I don't think she minded. To absolutely horrible unbelievable stories of a husband and wife trying to save their four small children but sadly losing all four to the flood waters. Jerry, the Post Commander an old Vietnam Veteran like myself said there are 39 confirmed dead, but close to hundred still missing, he lamented that "some will never be found".

They still need lots of help but probably not the kind of help we were lucky enough to deliver. What they told us they need now are cleanup supplies. Brooms, mops, shovels, rakes, squeegees, wet/dry vacuums, power washers, dehumidifiers and all kinds of cleaning supplies. I would recommend purchasing these items at your favorite online store and shipping them directly to the Hazard VFW Post 7387.

I look forward to all the Post anniversaries coming up in the next couple of months. We have several Posts celebrating 100-year anniversaries, some with 75 year anniversaries and a few 50 years. What a great accomplishment maintaining a Post to celebrate serving Veterans and your Community for a Century. I look forward to all the events I have the privilege of attending on your behalf. In September we have V-J Day, POW/MIA ceremonies, 9/11 Remembrances, the National Home, State Campout and District meetings. It's going to be a busy month.

One thing I mentioned many times at the School of Instruction and at the Council of Administration meeting was the Stats membership numbers. At the end of VFW year 2021-2022 the State was at 24,545 members! Just a few years ago we were over 40,000 members, during Buzz's year, we are losing about 2000 members per year. That's not deaths, it is simply members not renewing, we have to fix this and soon. Our Membership team has some great plans and are working hard but they can't do it alone. I have said it a



thousand times, MEMBERSHIP IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY! If each of us sign up just one new member or get one prior member to come back to the VFW, the State would be near 50,000 members at the end of the year. Just think about it – ONE NEW MEMBER!

The Auxiliary President Harriet Figg and I are working together on every aspect of the VFW of Indiana. We share many of the same aspirations for the Department and are determined to have a successful VFW year. But we can't do it without every member working with us.

Questionnaire for VFW Accountable Officers Crime Coverage

August 1, 2022

One of the most important communications you will receive during the year concerns the bond of your Unit Quartermaster. Section 703 of our National By-Laws requires that each accountable officer shall be bonded with an Indemnity Company as surety and the By-Laws places the responsibility for adequate bonding upon the Commander of the post. In any business it is customary to bond any officer handling funds. THE BOOKS AND RECORDS OF THE ACCOUNTABLE OFFICER MUST BE AUDITED AT LEAST QUARTERLY BY THE TRUSTEES. THIS IS TO COMPLY WITH SECTION 218 OF THE NATIONAL MANUAL OF PROCEDURES.

The Department Headquarters carries a Crime Policy for the bonding of Department and Post Accountable Officers. This Policy runs for a year – from September 1 to August 31 – premium payments are made on that basis. Coverage for all accountable officers expires on August 31 and premium for the New Year is due on September 1.

Any unit may decide whether it prefers to take out a Policy with some other surety company or have its funds protected by the Department Headquarters Crime Policy. But the matter should be given prompt attention because if your Accountable Officer had previously been covered through the National Headquarters, a new premium payment is required by September 1, 2022 and delinquent after this date.

IF THE POLICY IS NOT RENEWED, TERMINATED, OR CANCELLED AT EXPIRATION DATE OF 9-1-2022, THE POST HAS ONLY 90 DAYS TO SUBMIT A PROOF OF LOSS FOR PRIOR TERM. AFTER 90 DAYS PRIOR COVERAGE CEASES.

COVERAGES OF THE POLICY REQUIRE THAT:

- 1. You agree to make/or cause to be made, at least annually, an audit of your books and accounts, including complete verification of all securities and bank balances pertaining to each "employee and/ or volunteer".
 - If the above is not complied with, the Insurance Company will refuse to honor claim of missing funds which cannot be proven by records. Monthly audits and reconciliation of bank statements may avoid this denial of claim.
- 2. The Insurance Company will not pay for loss resulting from any unauthorized advances made by an "employee" to any member for delinquent dues and assessments.
- 3. "Employee" means any duly elected position, or any appointed officer as listed in the policy schedule.
- 4. POST MUST SUBMIT A PROOF OF LOSS FORM WITHIN 120 DAYS FROM THE FIRST DATE OF DISCOVERY OF THE LOSS. Proof of loss resulting from dishonest acts on the part of the bonded officer is required in settlement of claims.

THIS POLICY IS ONLY FOR THE YEAR SEPTEMBER 1, 2022 TO AUGUST 31, 2023.

The funds of your Post are protected only for that year. Premium for the following year will be due September 1, 2023.

As part of the Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen Programs awards the Foundation will provide the students with a tour of the War Memorial and surrounding monuments.


Assistance for Indiana Veterans
